## Atlantic Orchestra To Serve 'Gin And Tonic' Tomorrow

A musical "gin and tonic" will be served up at the July 17 Sunday concert by the Atlantic Orchestra, according to conductor John Fenwick.

The accent is on enjoyment, and Fenwick has chosen "music which to me seems suitable for summer," with mainly "major keys with chords in the signatures and lightness of orchestration."

This concert is also in keeping with Fenwick's aim for the entire concert-series to cover classical and modern periods and feature the works of Canadian-born composers.

Two works by Mozart, the Marriage of Figaro Overture and the Haffner Symphony, no. 35 represent the something-old part of the program, while the modern is taken care of by Anne Murray Adaskin's "Serenade Concertante." Also included are the program is Serge Prokofiev's "A Summer Day" from his delightful "Suite for Children."

Miss Eggleston's "Fanfare" is a short overture, one of five especially commissioned for the Summer Festival concerts.

## Colorful Canadian Financier Disposes Of Big Stock Block

NEW YORK (CP)—General Instrument Corp. has acquired 1,000,000 shares—nine per cent—of the common stock of Universal Controls Inc. from Louis A. Chesler, colorful Canadian financier.

Moses Shapiro, president of General Instrument, said 200,000 of the shares of the big Florida land development concern had been bought for cash at \$5 a share.

The remaining 800,000 are being purchased from Chesler with \$5,000,000 in four-per-cent promissory notes over a five-year period, Shapiro said Thursday.

He said one-half of the \$5,000,000 in notes is convertible into General Instrument common stock at \$50 a share.

If Chesler, who now lives in the Bahamas, exercises this option, he would get 50,000 of the 2,675,506 common shares outstanding of General Instrument, a Newark, N.J., producer of electronic components and equipment.

Stock of General Instrument closed Thursday at \$52.12 1/2, down 12 1/2 cents. It was the fourth most actively traded stock on the New York Stock Exchange, with 87,000 shares traded.

Universal Controls, which makes race-track pari-mutuel systems, rose 37 1/2 cents to \$5.25 on volume of 117,100 shares on the American Stock Exchange.
