Much interest was shown throughout the meeting and it was felt much had been accomplished. 99 representations of societies responded to roll call.

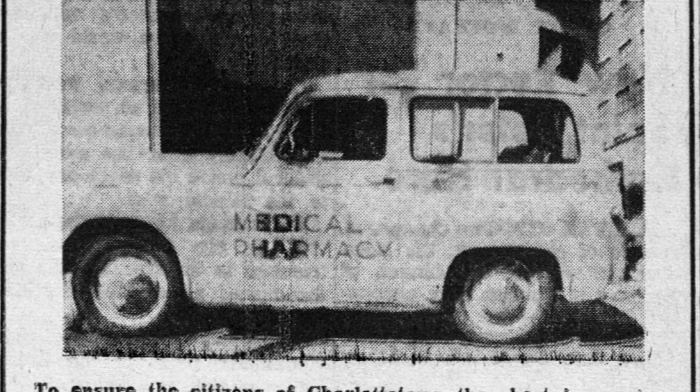
Cases Heard In Police Court
