**MONTRÉAL (CP) - G. B. Foster**, president of Canada and Dominion Sugar Co. Ltd., said that the company's sugar contracts are not the solution to Canada's sugar supply problem.

Long-term sugar contracts with Commonwealth countries—currently being discussed by the federal government—would result in lower prices in the immediate future and cost more in the long run when world supply catches up with demand, said Mr. Foster.

"Once world supplies catch up with world demand, sugar prices will return to normal quickly," he said.

Higher prices had dropped consumption of sugar in Canada three per cent in the first 10 months of this year.

In an interview, J. O. Whittier, Russell Hynes' managing director, said western refiners were able to place a ceiling on sugar prices because they had taken a position on the market.

He thought sugar when the price was low, so when it went up, they did not have to follow. He increases all the way to maintain their profit margin, said Mr. Whittier.

He said Canada and Dominion buys its sugar on a daily basis as most adhere to a raw sugar market fluctuation.
