Thieves Take Merchandise From Smallman's

—As far as could be learned last evening no trace has yet been found of the thieves or the stolen goods taken from the store of Smallmans Ltd. in an early morning break yesterday. The amount of goods taken is difficult to determine until an inventory is taken but it is known that four suitcases, a number of pairs of expensive shoes, shirts and socks and various other articles of merchandise were stolen.

The thieves gained entrance through a rear door in the basement. They entered the Woolworth store next to Smallmans and with the aid of what must have been a heavy crowbar forced back the heavy steel sliding door that separates Smallmans from the Woolworth premises. They also had to force a similar door between Woolworths and the Co-Op Super Market. Apparently nothing was taken from Woolworths and they did not attempt to enter the Co-Op store.

In forcing back the steel door leading into Smallmans the slit into which the lock fits was forced from the wall and the entire length of moulding torn loose from the door casing.
