VICTORY!

Great Conservative Triumph in East Elgin.

ST. THOMAS, Ont., Feb. 13. The election in East Elgin yesterday resulted in the return of Mr Ingram, the Conservative candidate, by 596 of a majority. This is an increase of 550 over the last election.

Yellow Fever Victims.

NEW YORK, Feb. 13. The British ship City Camp arrived yesterday from Santos. The old crew were all sent to the hospital at Santos. Capt. M. C. Cavanagh, of St. John, died of yellow fever. Charles Hurley, seaman, also died of the same disease.

The Osborne Case.

LONDON, Feb. 13. Mrs. Osborne, charged with perjury in connection with the Hargreave's stolen jewels, has been committed for trial. Great efforts were made to have the matter dropped, but the judge declared that his duty compelled him to commit her for trial.

Frost, Famine and Pestilence.

LONDON, Feb. 13. A despatch from Penseo, in the southern part of what is known as Great Russia, says that the thermometer registered 58° below zero; and that typhoid fever, smallpox and diphtheria are decimating the inhabitants.

Amendment Rejected.

LONDON, Feb. 13. In the House of Commons last evening Redmond's amendment to the address in favor of releasing the treason-prisoners was rejected by a vote of 168 to 97.

Schooner Lost.

EASTPORT, Me., Feb. 13. Yesterday's storm did much damage. The schooner Critlan had a hole knocked in her stern and she filled and sank.

Nihilists at Work.

LONDON, Feb. 13. A dynamite bomb was exploded in front of the Spanish Consulate to-day. This was the work, evidently, of Nihilists.

Typhus in New York.

NEW YORK, Feb. 13. The plague of typhus fever is growing in force in this city. There are now 67 cases under treatment.

Randy Again.

LONDON, Feb. 13. Lord Randolph Churchill has consented to run again for Faldington in the Conservative interest.

A Large Majority.

HALIFAX, Feb. 13. The majority for the Conservative candidates will be about 390.

Weather Bulletin.

TORONTO, Feb. 13. -10 a. m. Strong westerly to north westerly winds, generally fair and considerably colder; snow flurries in some places.

MADRID, Feb. 10 - The four condemned anarchist leaders in the attack of the society to create rebellion in Spain were garroted this morning in the plaza in front of the prison at Z-zera.
