\$100,000 Fire At Starch Plant

STE. AGATHE, Me., Feb. 1. — (AP)—A \$100,000 fire destroyed Albert R. Michaud's starch plant here early Wednesday.

Firemen fought the flames in temperatures reported at 42 below zero. Water froze in fire fighting equipment.

Cause of the fire, which at times threatened homes and other buildings in this little Aroostook County village near the Canadian border, was believed to have been spontaneous combustion. The plant consisted of two buildings—one for manufacture of starch and potatoes and one for drying it.

Explosion of a fuel tank at the height of the blaze sent flames hundreds of feet into the air.

Sees World View Against India In Kashmir Dispute

LONDON, Feb. 1 — (CP) — A British peer announced that world opinion is definitely against India in particular — in the dispute with Pakistan over Kashmir.

Lord Vansittart, who loathes Communism and doesn't hesitate to say so, wrote in the Conservative Daily Telegraph: "It is time for someone to say flatly that Mr. Nehru's attitude and his professed aims flatly contradict each other."

The Conservative peer, who was chief diplomatic advisor to the Foreign Office from 1938 to 1941, said it seems strange that Nehru should have so much conciliation for Communist China and so little for a fellow state in the Commonwealth, Pakistan.

Britain and other Commonwealth countries have been scrupulously neutral in the three-year-old dispute over Kashmir. Lord Vansittart is the first prominent public figure here to take sides.

Editorial opinion has also been against India. Reports during the recent Commonwealth Prime Ministers conference that Pakistan had accepted three possible solutions, the conflict, while India rejected them all, provoked criticism of Nehru by two Conservative newspapers, the Daily Telegraph and the Yorkshire Post.

One frequently-voiced argument is that Nehru is inconsistent in seeking to solve the dispute on a political rather than religious basis (Kashmir, like Pakistan, is predominantly Moslem.) Critics claim that Nehru did not apply the same formula in the case of Hyderabad.

The conflict in Kashmir jeopardizes stability in Southeast Asia. The next move is expected in the United Nations Security Council, where previous settlement attempts have been unsuccessful.

Report Truman Supporter Of Quoddy Project

WASHINGTON, Feb. 1 — (AP) — A Maine delegation called at the White House to urge President Truman to support development of a tidal power project on Passamaquoddy Bay between Maine and New Brunswick.

The group reported that Truman "needed no persuading."

"Truman said at a press conference Jan. 18 he endorsed the project."

Roscoe Emery of Eastport, vice-president of the Washington County Chamber of Commerce, said Truman was familiar with the project and assured the delegation he is in favor of development of northeastern power, including Quoddy.

The group is seeking a survey of the project, as recommended by the International Joint Commission, to determine economic practicability of the unique tidal-harnessing idea.

Commission engineers estimate the survey would cost \$3,900,000.

The Maine congressional delegation has introduced a bill to authorize such an appropriation by the United States. Any apportionment of the survey costs between the U.S. and Canada would be made on the basis of benefits, when and if the project is completed.

Emery said his group did not back any specific survey proposal in its informal meeting with Truman.

"We are interested solely in getting a comprehensive, unbiased survey by recognized engineers," he said. "We want it to be by engineers who are not prejudiced against public power."

Emery said that Truman asked the delegation to submit to him a detailed brief of the proposed international project.

The start of such a project — which on the part of the U.S. — was made and abandoned during the first administration of the late President Roosevelt.

Sales of Canadian Securities In U. S. Has Hit Skids

OTTAWA, Feb. 1 — (CP) — The American investor's big buying binge of Canadian securities has hit the skids.

Sales to the United States of \$37,600,000 worth of Canadian securities in November were down sharply from \$60,600,000 in October, \$173,000,000 in September and \$72,000,000 in August, the Bureau of Statistics reported today.

The August-September period was when speculation on an impending change in Canada's exchange policy was at its height, with American investors pouring in money in the hope of a quick profit.

The Government removed controls from the dollar Sept. 30.

Purchases of securities from the United States, on the other hand, have been generally high. The Bureau recorded purchases of \$34,100,000 in November, slightly below the \$40,200,000 in October, but higher than any other previous month in 1950.

In transactions with all countries, Canada's sales of \$40,000,000 and purchases of \$36,600,000 in November, left her with a balance of \$3,400,000, compared with \$17,300,000 in October, \$145,900,000 in September and \$72,000,000 in August.

Gangway Collapses, 16 Dead, 48 Injured

BELFAST, Northern Ireland, Feb. 1 — (AP) — A gangway leading to a ship collapsed Wednesday killing 16 workers and injuring 48 others.

The workers, crowding ashore at the end of a shift, fell 50 feet. Some were thrown into the water and others on to the pier beside the ship — the Juan Peron being outfitted as a whale factory ship for an Argentine firm.

The ship is a vessel of almost 30,000 tons.

It was the worst shipyard disaster in Belfast history. Eyewitness accounts said the scene was "heart rending," with cries and groans coming from men crumpled up on the wharf. Many of the injured suffered broken legs.

War Criminals Saved From Death

FRANKFURT, Germany, Feb. 1—(AP)—United States officials have saved from the gallows 21 convicted German war criminals, including six involved in the notorious Malmédy massacre, and freed the imprisoned arms king, Alfred Krupp, and eight of his aides.

The sweeping revision of U. S. war crimes sentences means no German will be executed for the Malmédy massacre in which several hundred unarmed U. S. prisoners of war and Belgian civilians were murdered in the Battle of the Bulge.

Fifteen of the 21 saved from death were ordered to serve life terms and the others from nine to 25 years.

The greatest mass clemency by any Allied power since the war came in the midst of efforts to woo Germans into Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower's European army and Gen. H. Arnold's "honorary German soldier" to be restored before Germans take up arms again.

Liberal Caucus Discusses Controls

OTTAWA, Feb. 1—(CP) — Government spokesmen have indicated at a private caucus of Liberal members that they will ask Parliament for powers to impose price and wage controls should they become necessary.

A Liberal member, leaving the meeting, said he had gathered that the Government did not plan to impose such controls immediately.

Prime Minister St. Laurent, External Affairs Minister Pearson and Trade Minister Howe addressed the members at the first caucus of the session. The session opened yesterday.

Meanwhile, Progressive Conservative members also gathered for a caucus. One source said they discussed the stand the party should take on the major issues expected to come before the Commons.

The C.C.F. and Social Credit members also met.

1950 Income Tax Forms Ready

OTTAWA, Feb. 1 — (CP) — The sad news is out: the 1950 income tax forms now are in the hands of your boss.

The Revenue Department have announced that it has completed distribution of the T-1 short income forms to Canadian employers.

About 8,000,000 have been shipped across the country, for distribution to about 3,000,000 potential Canadian taxpayers.

The forms will be distributed by employers to employees along with the T.R. slips, showing salary, wages and taxes deducted at source.

The deadline for completing the forms and sending them to income tax offices is April 30.
