# Top Quality Animals Are Seen In Holstein, Ayrshire Rings

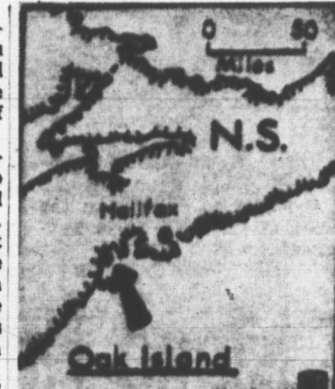

# Gas Believed Cause Of Death

OAK ISLAND, N.S. (CP) — Four men perished Tuesday in a gas-filled pit they hoped would lead them to a fortune in pirate gold on this little island off Nova Scotia's south shore. A fifth man was pulled unconscious from the 27-foot-deep hole and two others scrambled to safety before being overcome. The deaths were the first known to have occurred since legends that infamous Captain Kidd had buried treasure here began to lure treasure seekers to this island 45 miles from Halifax in 1795.

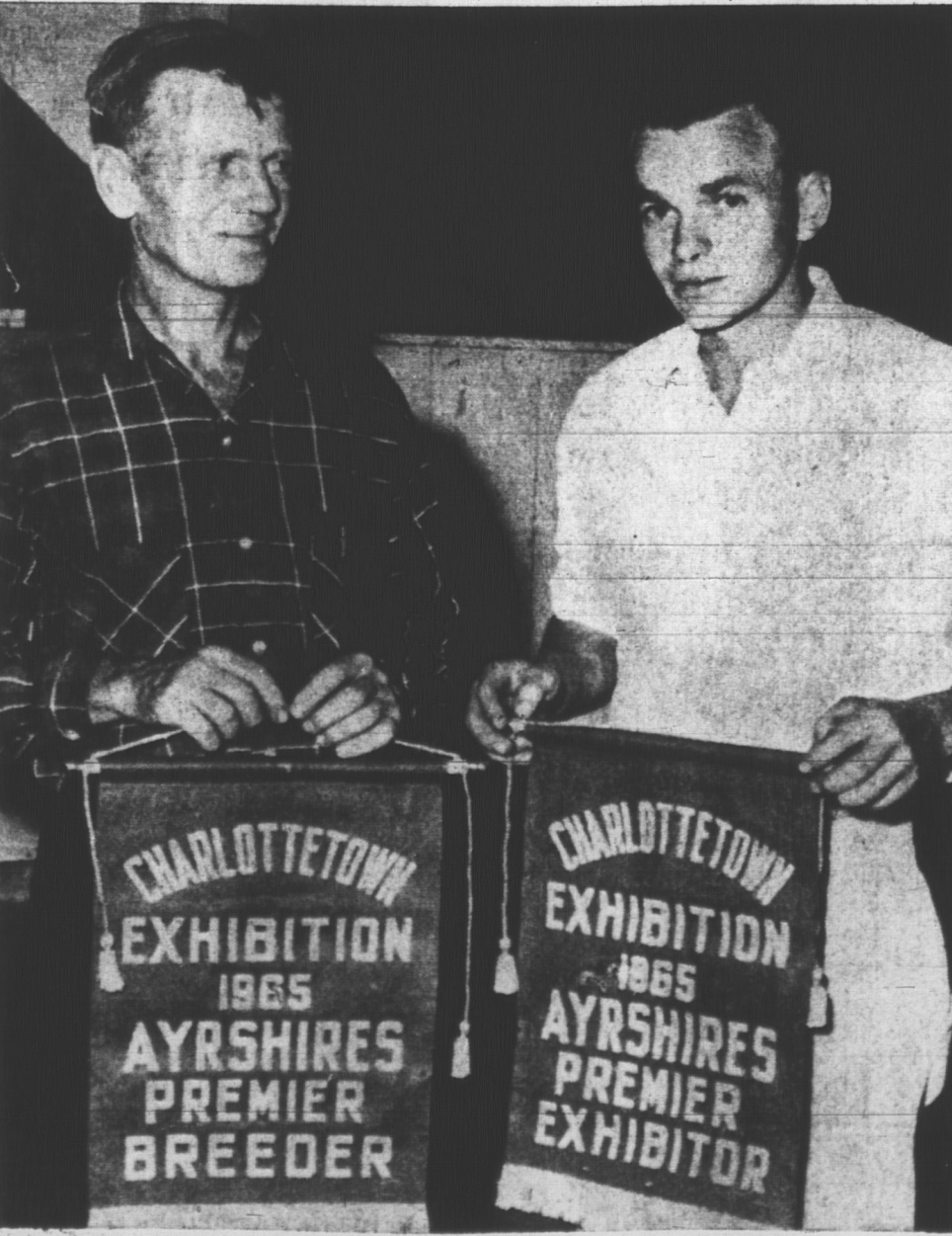
