Island Curlers Finish In Last

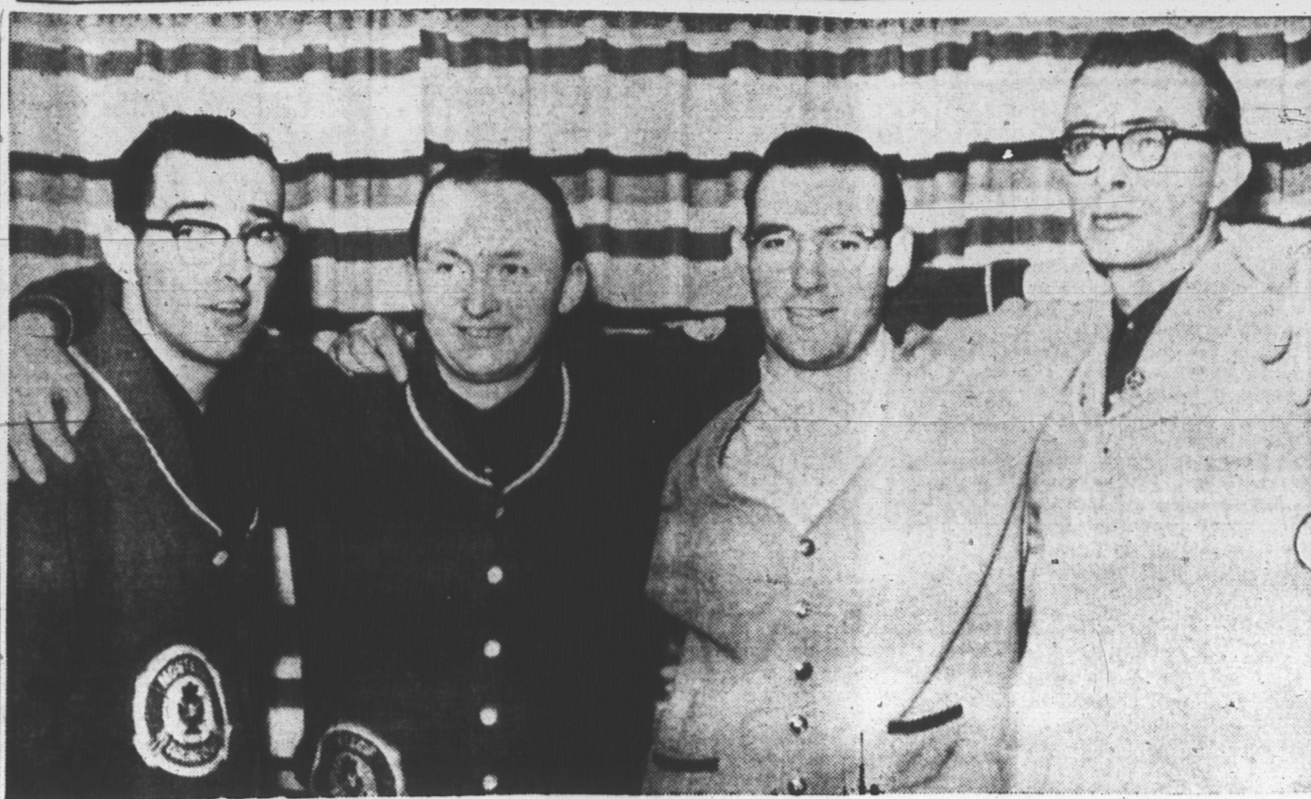

SEBRING, Fla. (AP)—Ken Miles and Lloyd Ruby, opposites in all ways except winning sports car races, Saturday won the tragedy-studded Sebring 12-hour sports car race.

Miles, of Los Angeles, a thin, hawk-faced, British-born automotive engineer, and Ruby, a ruddy, drawing curly-haired Texan from Wichita Falls, rewrote the record book in the gruelling race that left five dead.

They also gleaned extra points for Ford in its race for the world manufacturer's trophy, based on races throughout the world.

Richardson Cops Boxing Crown

GLACE BAY, N.S. (CP)—Blair Richardson of South, Bar, N.S., won the British Empire middleweight boxing championship here Saturday with a 13-round split decision over former titleholder Gomeo Brennan of The Bahamas.
