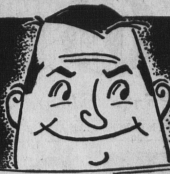

Earl Taylor Heads Society

Earl Taylor, Charlotteville, was elected president of the Prince Edward Island Historical Society this week. He succeeds Lorne Calbeck. Patron of the society is Lieutenant-Governor W.J. MacDonald. November Had Fewer Accidents

Although there were fewer motor accidents last November than in the same month of 1962 more people were injured and more property damage resulted. There were two people killed; the same number as in the previous November. The figures released by the registrar of motor vehicles revealed a total of 108 accidents, two of them fatal, 86 non-fatal and 70 with property damage only. The totals compare with 2, 25 and 90 in November of 1962 for a total of 117 accidents. Last November in addition to the two people killed 46 were injured compared to 30 in the similar month a year previous. Property damage amounted to \$56,842 compared to \$36,396 the year previous.

In the 108 accidents last November there were 179 vehicles involved and 170 drivers. The previous November with 117 accidents saw 203 vehicles and 191 drivers involved.

Dairy Heifers To Be Sold

Livestock Director L.W. Roper of the provincial department of agriculture said Wednesday that some 16 heifers from the Holstein herd of the Falconwood Farm will be offered for sale by auction.

Thirteen of the heifers are pure bred, practically all of them are from dams with satisfactory records of production, and several are from dams with high class pedigrees. Mr. Roper stated they run from two years to two and one-half years of age. Twelve heifers are carrying the service of an outstanding young sire bred at Falconwood Farm and are registered as settled. The others are open heifers.

The sale will be held at the barn in a sheltered spot. Should the weather be stormy the sale can be held inside, it was explained.

Impaired Case Is Dismissed

SUMMERSIDE — Magistrate R.S. Hinton, QC, yesterday dismissed a charge of driving while impaired against Perry Ellis Ramsay. The charge was laid following a car accident at the intersection of Pleasant and Summer streets, Dec. 31.

In dismissing the charge Magistrate Hinton said the evidence of defence witness Gordon Yee was enough to establish some doubt in the case. He added that he was rather surprised at the lack of evidence by the police witnesses, constables Walter R. Melman, Gordon Grady and Siguard MacKinnon.

Defence counsel Alexander Campbell called three witnesses including the accused and his wife, Mrs. Gwen Ramsay. Acting for the crown was Sergeant Harry MacKay in the absence of crown prosecutor George R. McMahon and police chief S.D.A. Wannamaker.

Penitentiary Terms Given For Car Thefts

Convicted on two charges of car theft, George Eric Dawson, was given concurrent two year sentences in Dorchester Penitentiary by Magistrate James R. Johnson, QC, in Queens County, magistrate's court yesterday.

He was convicted for stealing motor vehicles from J.A. Galant and Ralph A. Carragher, South of Southport. George William David Sauter, Hunter River, was convicted on a charge of unlawfully proceeding through a stop sign before it was safe to do so, and fined \$10 and costs of \$5. John Sterling Hamby, Spring Park Road, Charlottetown, was sentenced to 15 days in Queens County Jail on a charge of having care or control of a motor vehicle while intoxicated.

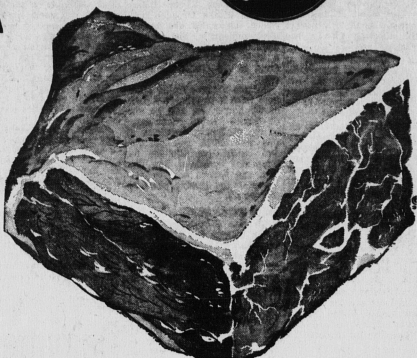
