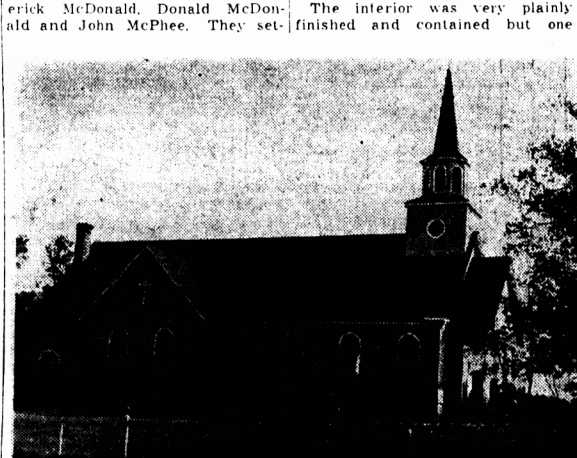

"Annual meeting of Georgetown School District No. 1 was held in the Town Hall on June 30, with Mr. S. C. Knight presiding. There were 16 ratepayers in attendance.

At the request of the meeting the names of property holders, in arrears of taxes, of which there were 85, were read. It was moved that all persons in arrears after August 1 have the amount of their arrears turned into the court for collection.

Mr. A. E. Jenkins was appointed auditor for the ensuing year. The secretary read the supervisor's report, which gave the school 145 points out of a possible 250. This report deals with the school building and grounds, and facilities and equipment therein.
