- More Senate Committees now have student representation

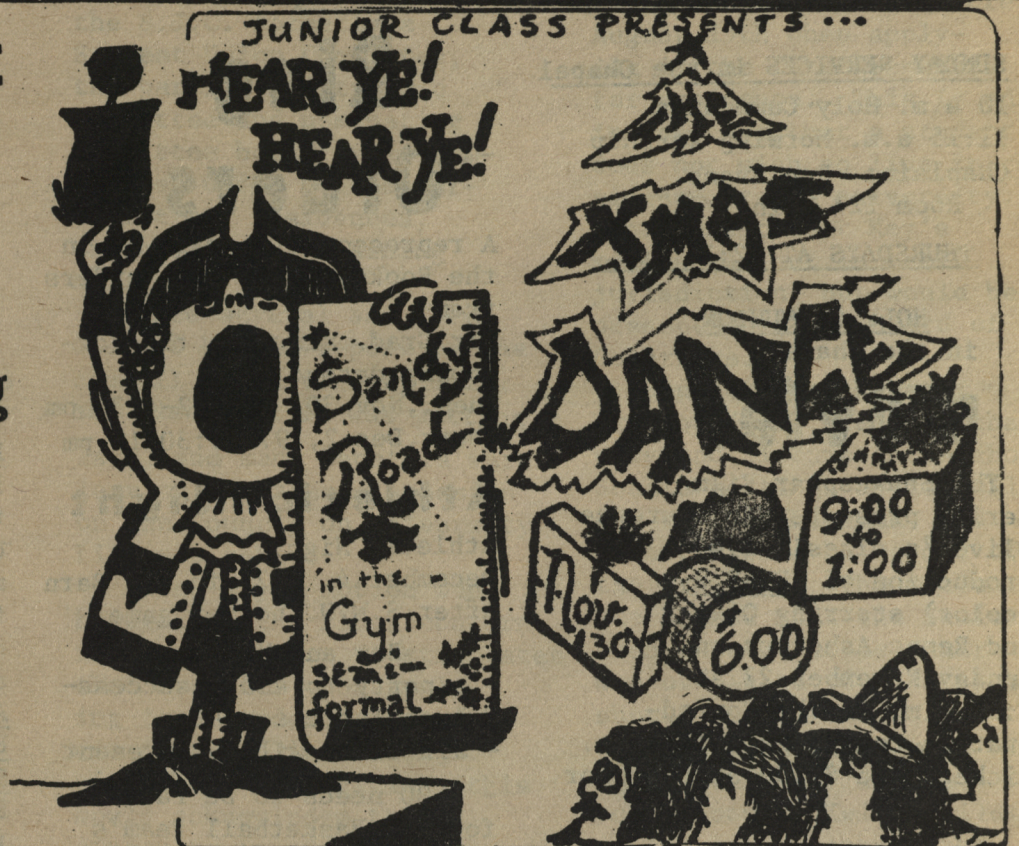
- Day Care Center negotiations concluded
