Boston popped off to trim the Yanks 4-2 and 10-5. Cleveland went 15 innings to the night. The Tigers 6-5 in the first game and then won the nightcap 8-5 while the Chicago White Sox split with Kansas City, winning 8-3 and losing 4-3, to slip to third place.
