C. A. A. A.—Good hard fought races are promised for Wednesday September 6th when the C. A. A. A. will hold their annual sports. There is no doubt the public will appreciate the novel features introduced on that day.

UNION CORNER PICNIC.—The annual picnic of the Union Corner (Fifteen Point) Methodist Sunday School took place last Saturday at the beach woods on Mr. Gordon Linkletter's farm. The place was well adapted for a picnic and those present, especially the little ones, much enjoyed the afternoon. Besides the members of the Sunday School there were a number present from Muddy Creek, Wellington, and Linkletter Road.

AMERICA'S GREAT LOCOMOTIVES.—The greatest locomotives in Canada, and there are very few on the continent that equal them in weight and power, are found on the Sydney and Louisburg railway. The latest addition to the company's equipment is a 121 ton locomotive, and the next largest is 117 tons. Trains of 100 cars have been hauled over the road loaded with 1,500 tons of coal, though the average coal train here is 900 tons. Fifty steel cars each of a capacity of 100,000 have been ordered. This rather beats Mr. Harris, who used to talk of the necessity of 60,000 pound cars on the Intercolonial.

Helping the Boers

LONDON, August 27.—The Cape Town correspondent of the Daily Mail says: Despite the virtual blockade of war material in Delagoa Bay, the Cape Government is sending enormous consignments of munitions of war to Bloemfontein. During the present month over 2,000,000 cartridges have been sent, and 500 rifles were despatched last night from Port Elizabeth to Bloemfontein. In addition to this the Cape Ministry, while absolutely declining to arm the volunteers of the colony, continues to afford other facilities to the Orange Free State to arm its burghers just across the water, freely granting the use of colonial railways for the distribution of cartridges from the Bloemfontein arsenal to the border towns. The patience of the people is becoming exhausted and unless the Imperial Government acts quickly and decisively, the gravest damage may ensue to British prestige.

CAPE TOWN, August 25.—A despatch from Bulawayo says that a Dutchman named Petrus Viljoen was charged there yesterday before a local magistrate upon a warrant issued by the British High Commissioner, Sir Alfred Milner, with inciting the natives of Bechuanaland to rebel against British authority. Viljoen was remanded.

Unpopular Regulations

OPORTO, Aug 27.—There has been a great exodus of the population since the Government announced its intention to establish a sanitary cordon around Oporto with the view of restricting the spread of the hebanonic plague. The proposal meets with much opposition. Dr. Pia Callada, the Governor of Oporto, has resigned as a protest. It is asserted that the cordon, if established, will produce a famine more injurious than the plague. Both railways are now closed, and the only exit is by the sea.
