Tignish Co-op Reports Most Successful Year

TIGNISH — The most successful year the Tignish Co-operative Association Ltd. has had to date was the report of Gerald Handrahan, manager, at the annual meeting held in the high school auditorium, Tuesday evening, before a large turnout of shareholders.

An increase of \$6,000 in volume and a very large decrease in accounts payable were two worthwhile achievements mentioned.

A five per cent rebate was voted and this rebate will stay in a five-year revolving credit plan, that was voted on unanimously at last year's annual meeting.

The financial statement was read and explained by Mr. Handrahan. He gave the net profit for each department, which is not the usual procedure, but he said it would give the members a better idea of what each department was doing.

The service station was noted by the auditor to have made a considerable profit over the past year.

The board of directors' report, read by Walter Christopher, noted improvements were made to grocery, dry goods, and meat departments, along with new wash rooms being added. An education course was carried out once a month during the year by staff members.

The minutes of the previous annual meeting were read by the secretary, Ray Handrahan. Wesley Gallant, president, chaired the meeting.
