

the two ports, which would increase greatly if the communication was certain and that more and more, when the railroad shall have been finished between Halifax and Pictou. We are confident that a time will come before the commerce between Charlottetown and Tatamagouche will induce the making of a junction line between the latter and Trenton. Mr. Mackenzie asks ten years' privilege, and by the end of that time, many changes may have taken place, and steamers may be running between both places, Pictou and Tatamagouche as well as Shediac, Richibucto and Miramichi.

We have also been informed, that an offer of a boring machine (complete), has been made to the proper quarry, for the price of £30 Halifax currency. We trust that this will be a boon. The sun is trifling compared with the advantages which may result from the use of it. So long as parties endeavor have to find the water, so long will the price per fathom, or yard, or foot, appear excessive, but the machine once furnished, the first 100 or 200 feet will be comparatively easy and cheap, and after that, it will be a question, whether it will be worth while to go further. It would be highly important to have at hand the means of ascertaining, whether water is to be had by boring for it, because if so, this will be a matter of great importance. We have no large reservoirs, lakes or rivers, as in the neighboring countries, but we may have hidden resources in the bowels of the earth, that only require tapping to give abundant supplies.

John Murray, Tailor, an inhabitant of this place, left Charlottetown on Sunday last, on board a vessel freighted with cattle, and bound for Newfoundland. The vessel anchored for the night at the harbor's mouth, near the buoy, when deceased went to bed. In the morning he was missing, at least such was the report, and he was found by two men who landed at the blockhouse and desired the keeper's wife to make a report of the fact to the friends of the deceased. The body was found this morning, and upon the Coroner's proceeding with the view, a severe contusion was discovered on the left side of the head, and the examination, Dr. Hobkirk gave it as his opinion to the Jury, that the wound was not likely by itself to have caused death, but that at the same time, he had no doubt that it had been inflicted some time previous to death, and that the immediate cause of the death of the party was drowning. Under the circumstances, the Coroner very properly adjourned the inquest until the return of the vessel.
