Attempt To Wreck Talks Charged Against Reds

By GEORGE KITCHEN Canadian Press Staff Writer WASHINGTON (CP) - The United States Monday charged the Soviet Union of trying, by its repeated charges against the U.S. to wreck the approaching big four talks on Germany.

The accusation was contained in an angry state department blast fired at Moscow in the deepening Soviet-American quarrel over U.S. aircraft flights in the Berlin air corridor and in international air space adjacent to the Soviet Union's frontiers.

Lincoln White, state department press officer, flatly rejected the "groundless" Soviet claims that the U.S. had violated the Berlin corridor by flying above 10,000 feet and that U.S. actions were straining relations between the two countries and dimming prospects for the foreign ministers' talks at Geneva next month.

White made it clear that the U.S. intends to fly its aircraft at more than 10,000 feet, if need be, despite a Soviet contention that west has no right to fly planes in and out of Berlin above that altitude. A U.S. plane flying at 20,000 feet was buzzed by Soviet jets in the air corridor Soviet Friday.

"It is a matter of record," said White, "that we have not and do not recognize any limitation on the right to fly at any altitude within the corridor."

At the same time, a U.S. government spokesman here said the United States is going into the Geneva talks "honestly" and with every intention of reaching a just settlement on the German problem but that the Russians did not help matters by "constantly bringing up gimmicks" such as the charge over Berlin air space.

"We have taken no action that could conceivably be regarded as dimming the Geneva prospects," he added.
