TORONTO (CP)—More than 15,000,000 copies of the Bible have been distributed in Canada during the last 50 years by the British and Foreign Bible Society in Canada, general secretary Rev. Dr. A. H. O'Neill told the organization's annual executive meeting Wednesday. The figure includes more than 1,500,000 copies in foreign languages given to immigrants, 1,500,000 copies the Canadian armed forces since beginning of the First World War and 16,000 copies given last year to grade VII pupils.

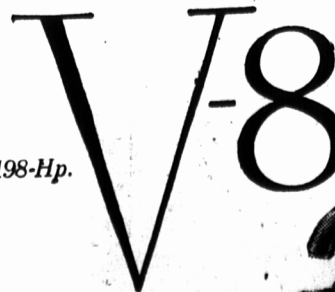

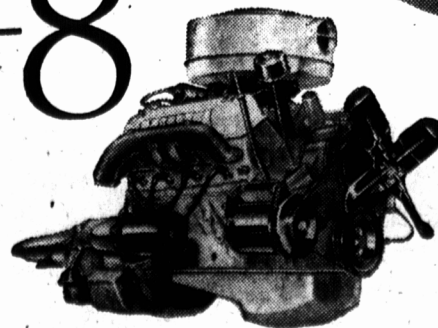
