ALABAMA STATE CONVENTION. MONTGOMERY, Ala., Sept. 25.—The Alabama State Convention passed an ordinance to-day abolishing slavery, by a vote of eighty-nine to three. The ordinance abolishes all previous relations of the slaves, protects the person and property of freedmen, and guards the State against the evils likely to arise from sudden emancipation. The Convention also passed an ordinance dividing the State into Congressional districts.

LETTER BY THE LATE PRESIDENT LINCOLN. NEW YORK, Sept. 25.—The Southern Advocate of Sept. 15, contains an extract from the Lincoln letter to General Wadsworth, who fell in the battle of the Wilderness. The letter, which is of a private character, is sent to Gen. Wadsworth by the late President's son, Lincoln, who desired the bestowal of the elective franchise upon the blacks, was also at an early day in favor of granting universal amnesty.
