Thoughts For Our Time

BLESSINGS LEFT AMID WRECKAGE
While all regret very deeply the tragic losses inflicted on Toronto by the hurricane two weeks ago, there is one aspect of the disaster that is consoling: this is the immediate response of the people of the city—and elsewhere—to the need of those who were afflicted. Side by side with the sad reports of families lost in the floods were stories of heroic rescues, sometimes at the expense of the lives of the rescuers. And from the night of the disaster itself, hundreds of people were ready to give their time and their labor, food from their shelves and clothing from their wardrobes, to those who were in need.

For some people these events may have been no more than interesting, an opportunity to gratify their curiosity. But for most Torontonians the disaster was something to open their hearts: a sudden and vivid reminder that the "brotherhood of man" is more than a trite phrase.

Whether or not we had relatives and friends in the Humber Valley, at Holland Landing, or near the other rivers that went out of control, we felt that these tragic losses touched us very close to home, and we were and are glad to assist any of the survivors who have lost so much.

NOT WEAKNESS
Why, I wonder, should it take such a disaster to awaken us to the "Brotherhood of Man?" The phrase has a ring of forced enthusiasm about it. In an age of

man who could remain unmoved by disasters such as these, unwilling to assist those who need assistance, does harm not only to them but to himself. So far from being strong, such a person is really less a man for his coldness in the face of such a heartrending trouble.

Even if we can do nothing else for the afflicted, we owe them our sympathy and our prayers. For we are part of the same human family; and we cannot live as if we were all on separate

planets, undiscovered by each other. Our brotherhood is not a matter of choice: we are brothers because we are men, all created by the same Father in Heaven. And this bond was immensely intensified when Christ became man, raising our brotherhood to a new dignity by sharing it Himself. We value our neighbor therefore, not only because he is precious in the eyes of God. If he suffers, in some way we also suffer; and in our suffering we are better men.

Whether we are faced with the problem of survival in the wake of the hurricane, or simply with life in what the neurotic psychologist calls "the neurotic personality of our age," we cannot get along as isolated individuals. Far from being weakness the "brotherhood of man" is really our strength; and if Communism can keep a sense of brotherhood while we lose it, atom bombs and hydrogen bombs will be of no use in our defense.

Nor is it simply a matter of what we can do for other people, or what they can do for us. A tragedy like the one two weeks ago reminds us sharply, however, that there is no weakness about calling another man one's brother. In such a disaster the need for men for one another's support and assistance is a basic condition of survival. And experience shows that in matters of this sort, such catastrophes of nature differ from personal crises only in the number of people that are affected.
