By ROBERT TUCKMAN BERLIN (AP) — Soviet-controlled East Germany broadcast Friday night that Dr. Otto John, West German security chief, fled voluntarily to the Communist zone. He has information which could wreck the West's whole counterspy network in East Germany.

The East German radio said in its special broadcast John's task now would be to work for reunification of all Germany. It presented during the broadcast a voice it said was that of the missing West German intelligence chief.

MAY REVAMP PLANS

It was the first word from the East about the man whose disappearance may force Britain and the United States to overhaul all their underground operations in the east zone.

Clears Soldier Of Charges

FT. DIX, N.J. (AP)—An eight-man army court-martial board Friday night found Lieut. Richard S. Morgan, 28, of Wilkes-Barre, Pa., not guilty of charges of "dereliction of duty" for allegedly allowing a company of trainees to stand at attention in 92-degree heat for almost an hour.

The eight officers deliberated an hour in making their decision after five days of hearings in which Morgan testified in his own defence.

ARMY DISCLOSES DETAILS OF \$10,000 FURNITURE - MOVING RACKET IN QUE.

By BERTRAND THIBAUT Canadian Press Staff Writer QUEBEC (CP) — Brig. Frank Fluey, officer commanding the eastern Quebec military area Friday announced that 32 army men and one civilian were involved in a \$10,000 furniture-moving racket that started last May at nearby Valcartier army camp.

CLAIMED "MOVING" COSTS

The men defrauded the army by submitting bills incurred for moving their families and furniture from former posts, Brig. Fluey said. In all but three cases the families were never moved.

COURT MARTIAL LIKELY

"A court martial is more likely in this affair," he said. "Whereabouts of the 13 men still to be picked are not known, he said.
