WAR NEWS.

ITALY TO THE RESCUE OF HER SUBJECTS.

Greek Legislators Afraid to Meet.

Interview Between the King of Greece and the British Minister.

LONDON, April 29.—Despatches from Rome say that news has been received there from Athens, announcing that the popular ferment against King George and his Government has become grave. As a result, the Italian Government has ordered Admiral Canevaro, the Italian commander in Cretan waters, to send the Italian ironclads Sardegna and Umberto and the Italian cruiser Montello to the Piraeus in order to protect Italian subjects in the event of trouble. It is believed at Rome that the despatches further announce that the Powers will intervene between Turkey and Greece after the Turks have occupied Volo.

ATHENS, April 29.—Again, yesterday, there was no meeting of the assembly for want of a quorum. Therefore the extraordinary session of that body was further postponed.

The city is quite quiet. The British Minister here paid a long visit to the King yesterday and the newspapers connect the incident with the possible intervention of Great Britain in the war.

The Crown Prince will remain at the head of the army.

LONDON, April 29.—A special despatch from Athens says that a general engagement between the Greeks and Turks is expected at Velesinos to-day.

NEWS FROM THE CAPITAL

Discordant Notes in the Government Tune.

The Atlantic Winter Terminus

OTTAWA, April 29.—The debate on the budget was continued yesterday afternoon by Mr. Richardson. Though a strong Liberal, he protested against the new duties on lumber, oil, agricultural implements and fruit.

Mr. Ellis put the following question: "Referring to the fast line, the Finance Minister, in 1894, stated to the House that Halifax, or St. John, or both, were in provisional agreement to be the Canadian winter terminus of the line. What is the present arrangement or understanding with regard to the said terminus?"

Mr. Laurier replied that the Government is aware of the statement referred to. The question of the whole matter is at present undergoing careful consideration by the Government, and as soon as the arrangements are completed they will be brought down.

A Government caucus was held yesterday. It was proposed to discuss the Crow's Nest Railway matter; but illness kept Hon. Mr. Blair away and the party talked about the tariff. There were some expressions of disapproval, and many explanations were called for. The meeting was not in harmony.

Mayoralty of Halifax.

HALIFAX, April 29.—Alex. Stephens was elected Mayor of this city, yesterday, by 357 of a majority.

Montreal, April 27.—A sensation has been created in political circles here owing to the reported adverse decision of Mr. Merry del Val, the papal delegate to Canada, on the government's settlement of the Manitoba school question. It is stated to night on good authority that J. Israel Tarte, minister of public works, on this account, is strongly in favor of an immediate dissolution of parliament, and an appeal to the people to endorse the arrangements entered into with the Manitoba authorities. The minister urges that with a hostile decision of the pope's representative it is only natural to suppose the Quebec province would not support the government as strongly as is the case today, while on the other hand, Mr. Tarte believes that the French Canadian premier would obtain an overwhelming majority from the English speaking provinces, and thus give the school question its quietus.

MAY MAGAZINES.

Harper's for May opens with "Cross-Country Riding in America," by Caspar Whitney, illustrated by C. Dana Gibson and others. "A few Native Orchids and their Insect Sponsors," in a study of cross fertilization, written and illustrated by the late William Hamilton Gibson. "White Man's Black Man," the seventh of Poulney Bigelow's series entitled "White Man's Africa," is a study of the African negro as a laborer. The illustrations are by R. Canton Woodville. "Two Undescribed Portraits of Shakespeare," by John Corbin, introduces what is probably the only life portrait of Shakespeare in existence. The engravings are by H. Barnett Woodburn. "Geological Progress of the Century" is the fourth of the series of illustrated articles, by Henry Smith Williams, M. D., treating the contribution of the nineteenth century to science. "English Country House Life" gives a familiar view of the most characteristic phase of upper-class life in England. "The Hundred Years' Campaign," by Professor F. N. Thorpe, is a study of the development of U. S. political parties. In the eighth instalment of "The Martian" the mystical implication of the planet Mars is fully developed. The short stories are "The Captured Dream," an idyl of domestic life, by Octave Thanet, illustrated by W. T. Smedley; "The Education of Bob," by Rebecca Harding Davis; "The Lion Tamer," by Henry Gallup Paine; and "A Guardian Angel," by Harriet Prescott Spofford, illustrated by W. T. Smedley. In the "Editor's Study" Charles Dudley Warner discusses the American newspaper. The opening story of the "Editor's Drawer" is "The Upset at Johnnycake Hill," by James Buckham.

INTERESTING NEWS NOTES SELECTED FOR THE EXAMINER.

The steamer Kaiser, of the German East African Line not long since unloaded at Lorenzo Marquez, Delagoa Bay, 1,650 cases of war material for the Transvaal. Among them there was a whole battery of heavy guns for the forts at Pretoria, and large stores of artillery ammunition.

Colonel John Hay, the new United States Ambassador, arrives in England on May 2—six days before Mr. and Mrs. Bayard take their departure. Mr. Bayard is very proud of being able to take back with him the much discussed log of the Mayflower.

Count Schouvaloff is not dead, as has been reported. He resigned the Governor-Generalship of Poland some time back owing to serious illness, and is now in Berlin for the purpose of undergoing an operation. Had it not been for ill-health, Count Schouvaloff would undoubtedly have been appointed Russian Minister for Foreign Affairs. He stood high in the favor of the late Czar, and is a persona grata with Czar Nicholas II.

Through the generosity of Sir Donald Smith, who has offered to defray the expenses of its foundation, a chair of zoology is about to be instituted in the Faculty of Arts at McGill University. Hitherto the subject of zoology has been taught at McGill College by Dr. Deeks, whose growing professional duties have, however, induced him to express a wish to be relieved of the work of teaching. In a recent communication to the governing board, Sir William Dawson strongly advocated the foundation of a full chair of zoology, the occupant to give his whole time to the work. The suggestion has now been acted upon, and McGill University will now have a chair of zoology second to none on the continent.
