Magistrate's Court At Georgetown

Weekly Magistrate's Court was held in the Court House in Georgetown on Thursday, June 14th at 10:00 A. M. by King's County Shipendary Magistrate, Joseph W. MacDonald, K.C. Police Probe Fire At Grandview

Four vacant buildings owned by Mr. Victor Sanderson of Grandview burned to the ground Thursday night including a barn, garage, workshop, and henhouse. The fire was first noticed by Mr. Clarence Gillis at 11 p.m., who immediately drove for help. A large crowd assembled, but the fire was not extinguished until five hours later, when the buildings were a total loss. The dwelling was saved.

Mr. Sanderson is an employee of the Canadian National Railways, and lives in Summerside. The origin of the fire is unknown, but owing to the fact that the buildings were vacant, there is a suspicion of arson. The R.C.M.P. Montague Detachment are investigating the case.
