Japan Signs Peace Treaty With 48 Countries

Russia Suffers Defeat But Treaty Signing Not Unqualified U.S. Victory

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 9—(AP)—The signing of the Japanese peace treaty Saturday by most of the Allied victors of the Second World War represented the worst diplomatic defeat Russia has suffered since the war ended. To claim an unqualified triumph for United States diplomacy in pushing through the pact, however, is only part of the story, as members of Western power delegations concede.
