Souris Board of Trade Holds Annual Meeting

Mr. Arthur Wright was elected President of the Souris Board of Trade at the annual meeting held on Wednesday night in the Town Hall, Souris. He succeeds Mr. B.L. Stewart. The newly elected Vice-President is Mr. Peter MacAulay. Mr. Charles Boylan was re-elected Secretary-Treasurer. The executive council includes, Messrs. B.L. Stewart, Paul Gallant, Roy White, J. Brenton St. John, William Acorn, Ray Leard and Alex Mooney. An ambitious program was laid out for the coming year and plans were formulated to increase membership by each member of the executive enrolling five new members.

In his report the retiring president, Mr. Stewart, outlined some of the achievements of the past year and pointed out the need for renewed and vigorous effort on the part of all so that the Town may continue to go forward. In concluding Mr. Stewart extended his thanks to the members for their cooperation and bespoke for his successor the same fine spirit. Following the election of officers, several pertinent questions occupied the meeting and a strong resolution was drafted for submission to the Minister of Fisheries, drawing to the attention of the government the need for adequate shore facilities and pointing out that the port of Souris, lying immediately adjacent some of the finest fishing grounds on the continent, would be the logical site to establish a fresh fish processing plant. The President reported that the contract had been called for the re-construction of the Souris breakwater, a project that has had the vigorous backing of the Board.
