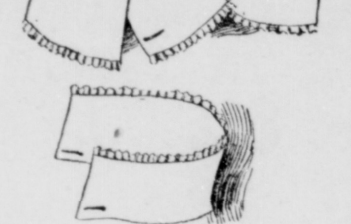

They are of all sorts and conditions. There are simple turn-over collars and cuffs of white linen...

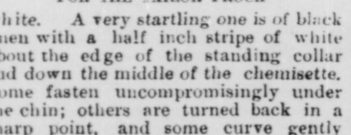
The chemise collars come plain, striped, dotted, in the simple and low-collared. The latest ones are striped in narrow lines of black and white.
