Newsman Recalls Brief Meeting With Adm. Byrd

A reminiscence:

The Commander was very much Annapolis-naval-academy type, or what we took for that. He stood very erect with a reserved but approachable manner and spoke with polished and precise politeness.

Personally we liked him, and as young reporters, were impressed by him, but he didn't seem to rate very high as news.

He was in charge of two or three air planes which were aboard an American exploration schooner which was heading north and south to spend a distinguished career in Arctic and Antarctic exploration.

I never had the opportunity to interview him again, but out of that one brief occasion I have always thought of him as a man who could never do a discourteous thing.

I thought of that and of the chance Sydney meeting when I read that he had died in Boston Monday.

SCIENTISTS MEET

Toronto will be a world scientific centre for two weeks, Sept. 3-14, when more than 1,500 scientists from 50 countries will attend the General Assembly of the International Union of Geodesy and Geophysics.

I don't remember whether we wrote anything at all on what the commander said, and if we did it was little.

We didn't know then that within a year or two he was to become famous.

For he was Commander Richard E. Byrd—later Admiral Byrd—who was to be the first man to fly over both North and South Poles and to spend a distinguished career in Arctic and Antarctic exploration.

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Chief purpose of the meeting is to discuss the opening of the 1958-1959 International Geophysical Year which will have started in July, and to lay final plans for the balance of it.

From July to the end of 1958, says a press release, experts in 14 fields of research will investigate the earth from pole to pole and from ocean floor to outer space at a cost of more than \$300,000,000.

All over the world simultaneous measurements will be taken on such phenomena as the aurora, cosmic rays, meteors, the upper atmosphere, glaciers, oceans, gravity, magnetism, earth tremors, solar flares and sunspots.

Toronto meetings will be held in Hart House, University of Toronto and arrangements are in charge of Prof. J. T. Wilson, head of the university's geophysics laboratory.

Provincial Dividends Are Ruled Taxable

OTTAWA (CP)—Revenue Minister McCann said Monday the federal government regards provincial dividend payments in Alberta as taxable income.

However, payments under British Columbia's proposed plan of municipal tax rebates will not be taxed.

He said in the Commons the advice of his officials is that the Alberta payments, coming out of oil and gas royalties paid to the province, are income and therefore taxable.

However, unlike dividends paid by corporations, the Alberta government dividends will not be subject to a 20-per-cent tax allowance or to depletion allowances.

Alberta proposes payments totalling \$11,000,000 to all its residents aged 21 or more who have lived in the province more than five years.

The B.C. plan, he said, is in the form of municipal tax rebate and therefore not taxable by the federal government. The government will pay the municipalities \$28 for tax rebates claimed by each householder. The rebate will be \$28 a householder.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

The bidding:
North East South West
1 NT Pass 3 ♣ Pass

Opening lead—eight of diamonds.

Among the more remarkable plays in bridge is one known as the grand coup, where declarer is able to bring about a situation which results in taking a finesse in a suit which he does not even lead.

East took the king-ace of diamonds and led a third diamond which West ruffed. A club was then returned and dummy's ten held the trick. Declarer had to take the remaining tricks to make the hand.

The king of hearts was led, West showing out. Another heart was played from dummy, South win-

ning with ten. Declarer still had the A-J of hearts over East's Q-9, but there were no more hearts in dummy to lead through East's Q-9 to pick them up.

It is a fact that many players at this point would concede a trump trick and go on to the next deal. That such action would be too hasty can be shown by watching how South proceeded with the play until he finally trapped East's queen.

Declarer had four trumps left to East's two. His first aim was to cut the number of his trumps down to two and accordingly, he led the king of spades, overtook with the ace, and trumped the six of spades.

Next South led a club to dummy and ruffed the queen of spades. Declarer's three remaining cards consisted of the A-J of hearts and the queen of clubs.

Dummy was then entered with the club and a diamond was led East's last two cards the Q-9 of hearts—were trapped. Declarer's A-J of hearts had to make the last two tricks. In effect, a trump finesse was taken through East.

The end position created by South was preceded by the two factors necessary to achieve a trump coup. Declarer first reduced his trump length to equal East's. He also arranged to have the lead in dummy at a time when East had to trump. From then on there was nothing to it.

BRITAIN WON'T SAY

LONDON (AP)—The government refused Monday to say how many H-bombs Britain will explode in her nuclear weapons tests in the Pacific this spring. Supply Minister Aubrey Jones said only that "the number of test explosions will certainly be limited."
