THE GALLANT GENERAL EGAN

Testifies With Tears in His Eyes.

THE U. S. SENATE AND THE PEACE TREATY.

It Will Not be Discussed Behind Closed Doors.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 27.—General Egan testified at the court martial yesterday with a great vehemence, and tears stood in his eyes.

His plea was justification and provocation for his charges.

The Senate does not exhibit much desire to discuss the peace treaty behind closed doors, which is proposed by Senator Hoar and other opponents of the treaty, who demand the production of the papers, which are withheld as confidential.

SONS OF TEMPERANCE.

Quarterly Session at Winsloe—A Large Attendance.

The Grand Division of Prince Edward Island met in quarterly session yesterday with Holdfast Division at Winsloe. There was not a very large attendance at the morning session, but the afternoon session was largely attended. The public meeting in the evening was attended by an immense concourse of people.

The addresses were all to the point and received the close attention of the large audience, and the literary and musical programme was greatly appreciated.

Before the meeting closed votes of thanks were tendered Holdfast Division and the people of Winsloe for courtesies extended, and to the choir for their excellent music.

The next quarterly meeting will be held at Hunter River in April.
