COMMENDABLE.—Messrs. Hickey & Stewart, Tobacconists, of this city, although having manufactured tobacco on hand, sufficient to supply the wants of their customers for the next three months, are receiving daily importations, by "Northern Light," of leaf tobacco, direct from the plantations, rather than see their men go unemployed until the regular opening of navigation. White says "he stood outside Mr. Holland's door while Madden and McAree went in and stole the money, and that they gave him no part of it."
