Unfair Potato Propaganda Refuted By Senator Pirie

GRAND FALLS, Sept. 23—Unfair and misleading propaganda emanating from certain sources in the United States regarding the Maritime Province potato industry, and particularly the quantity of potatoes exported by these provinces to the United States, was dealt with in a statement issued by Senator F. W. Pirie, Grand Falls, leader of the New Brunswick potato growers and exporters and long a champion of this great industry of the province.

Senator Pirie took strong issue to a grand total of 9,600,000 bushels of which potatoes accounted for just a little less than 8,000,000 bushels and table stock 3,700,000 bushels. Official United States department of agriculture figures for this same period are slightly at variance, showing a total importation of 10,000,000 bushels.
