Montreal (CP) — Industrials advanced irregularly at the close of a moderately active session on the stock market Monday. There were several strong performers and a dozen new highs established for the year.

Lower-priced speculative issues were active in the mining section. Papers and base metals were strong, the latter firming after an irregular opening. Beverages moved up narrowly. Utilities fluctuated while steel banks and senior oils were shaded. Carriers were mainly steady.

Ogilvie, in active trading, soared 7 3/4 points to a new peak of 53 while Ford climbed 3 to a new top of 158. Other improvements were noted in Canadian Vickers, Weston, International Paper, Aluminium and Stelco.

BC Forest, strong in recent sessions, was weak in active dealings. Acenic and Gunnar were bright spots in the mining section.

New York Stocks

NEW YORK (AP) — A quick about face in closing minutes of trading Monday sent the stock market down.

The late selling depressed the railroads and cut prices throughout the entire list. Union Pacific, a key stock, was off 3 1/2 at 171 1/2.

Motors and steels, together with a number of individual issues, made the best showing, and they held fairly well to their gains at the close.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was off 50 cents at \$181.10. Volume was 2,390,000 shares.

The low priced stocks were heavily traded. At the head of the list was ACF Brill off 1 1/2 at 20 1/2 on 45,500 shares. It has been strong recently on merger plans. Philip Morris was up 1 1/4 at 11 1/2.
