CITY SCHOOL BOARD.
The Bishop's Proposal Relative to St. Joseph's Convent Rejected.
There was a full attendance of members at the meeting of the City School Board held last evening, which was presided over by Mr. Stanislav Blanchard, chairman of the Board. Representatives of THE EXAMINER, Patriot, Guardian and Herald were in attendance.
After the minutes of the last meeting had been read and approved, and a communication from Principal Miller relative to the suspension for bad conduct of a boy in one of the departments in West Kent School had been passed upon, the consideration of the memorial of His Lordship Bishop Macdonald relative to St. Joseph's Convent was taken up. The chairman explained that the substance of the Bishop's memorial was that he desired the Board to take over St. Joseph's Convent and its appertinances and engage the nuns as teachers providing they obtain license as provided by the Public Schools Act.
The subject matter of the memorial was then discussed at length by Dr. Taylor and Messrs. Handrahan, D. G. McLeod, J. B. Macdonald, Archibald Kennedy, and D. Farquharson. The great objection to the proposal seemed to be that the distinctive part of the nuns would give the school a sectarian character, and it was also pointed out that the Board would not have the same control over the nuns that they had over other teachers. In support of the proposal it was pointed out by Messrs. Handrahan and Macdonald that in consequence of the convent school being maintained privately during the past twenty years the Board had been relieved of the necessity of providing for the education of some two or three hundred children. The Catholic taxpayers contributed towards the support of the public schools besides supporting the convent, and they should have some redress. They did not think objection should be taken to the name because of their distinctive garb, and thought that they should be allowed to teach providing they hold the necessary license.
Mr. Handrahan then submitted the following resolution:
Whereas, His Lordship the Bishop of Charlottetown has addressed a memorial to this Board requesting it to take over St. Joseph's School, rent the School building and accept the nuns as teachers, they being duly qualified and complying in every respect to the rules and regulations of the Board.
Therefore Resolved, that the prayer of His Lordship Bishop Macdonald be accepted by this Board.
Mr. J. B. Macdonald seconded the motion.
On being put to a vote the resolution was declared lost on the following division:
Ayes—Handrahan and Macdonald.
Nays—Taylor, McLeod, Kennedy and Farquharson.
It was decided to postpone consideration of the memorial relative to the establishment of a new school at the eastern end of the city until next meeting of the Board.
After passing some bills the meeting adjourned.

A POOR IRISHMAN IN LUCK.
Patrick Meloy, an Irish Nationalist, who served eleven years in an English prison for participating in the famous Manchester rescue of political prisoners, was last week found to be an inmate of the poor house at Dunning, Ill., after a search had been made for him in St. Louis and Chicago to apprise him of the fact that a Dublin estate was his by the death of an uncle, John Meloy. The estate consists of a carriage factory and seven buildings. Meloy came to America in the sixties, but returned to Dublin in 1867 to assist in the rescue. Twelve years afterwards he came to St. Louis and opened a restaurant and was a delegate last year to a convention of Irish Nationalists in Indianapolis. Edward Noyes, a partner of Austin Bidwell, the famous Bank of England forger, recently received word that Meloy, whom he knew in Ireland, was heir to the estate and started the search.
