France Makes A-Bomb Plans Test Next Year

By DAVID REID PARIS (Reuters) — France is making an atom bomb and, plans to test it next year, informed sources said Friday.

A defence ministry spokesman said studies now being made will result in practical applications both in the civil and military fields.

The sources said, however, the military plans have been completed and parts of the bomb now are being manufactured.

This would make France the second power possessing the atomic bomb after the United States, Russia and Britain.

Enterprise, a weekly business magazine, said France will explode its first atom bomb next spring.

"Work started in 1954," the magazine said. "It is being carried out in the greatest secrecy at a speed which astounds our allies."

Officials of France's atomic energy commission have said work on nuclear energy so scientific and industrial purposes is advanced to the point of producing a prototype of a reactor.

Jules Moch, French delegate to the United Nations disarmament talks, said New York City reports that France would like to accept a NATO disarmament agreement which would not be reached.

France, he said, would not be content to remain the only Big Four power without nuclear weapons of its own.

In past months, France clearly has evaded any commitment that would deprive it of the right to make atomic weapons.

In realising the six-power treaty for a West European atomic pool, France agreed to pool its nuclear resources for peaceful purposes but expressly reserved the right to make military weapons.

Defence Minister Jacques Chaban-Delmas told a press conference last week that France would accept no NATO disarmament agreement which would deprive it of the right to make atomic weapons.
