2. When you hear an event is sold out, please phone the Student Union to be sure, and so you won't be disappointed by not getting a ticket.

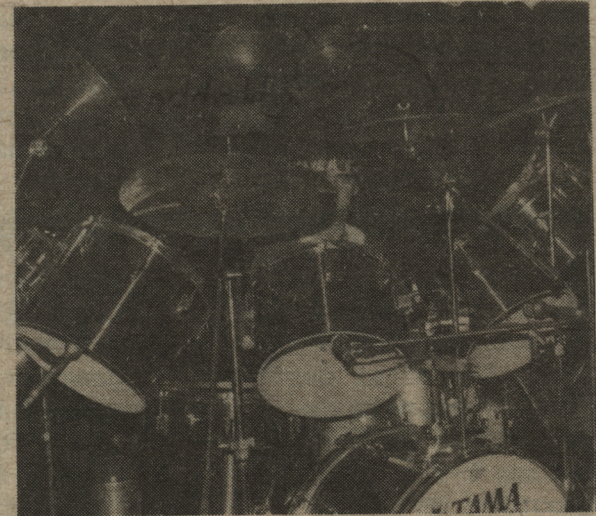
3. No one can purchase more than 6 tickets to any main event. This is done so students have a chance to get their tickets.
