

North Lake Notes.

The firm of Esters Bros., of Souris, have recently opened a branch store in this vicinity, which affords great facilities during the bad roads.

The school in this district is progressing rapidly under the skillful administration of Mr. A. J. McPhee.

During the past season some very nice residences have been erected, adding greatly to the attractions of this place. Among them must be mentioned the residence of Mr. Frank Baker, which is, in truth, a triumph of architectural skill, and is finished and furnished with all the modern conveniences.

Another correspondent writes:—"We are favored, as are the other parts of the Island, with a share of the extraordinary fine weather, but, unluckily, have no roads, so that our farmers are not able to get on very well with the work of the winter months."

Quite an interest is being taken in the project of making a harbor at North Lake, and we hope to see it a success at some future time. The most prominent agitators are Mr. Thomas Rose and Mr. Elisha Baker, who is a warm friend to the people in all matters.

England's Little Wars.

THREE SEPARATE AND INDEPENDENT AFFAIRS ON HAND AT THE PRESENT TIME.

It is a curious example of the burdens of the British Empire that England, having just completed two campaigns—one against the Black Mountain tribes in the northwest of India, and the other against the Thibetans, in Sikkim, in the heart of the Himalayas—is at the present moment engaged in three separate and independent wars, small ones, it is true, but still wars in every sense of the word. Troops have been armed, equipped and provisioned, and are now marching into partly unknown and hostile unfamiliar districts, inhabited by hostile people who will surely fight.

The first and most important of these campaigns is against the Lusais, in the hill behind Chittagong, who are habitually raiding British territory and murdering British officers and subjects.

Then there is an expedition to conquer the Chins, a powerful and turbulent tribe inhabiting the mountainous districts in North-west Burma bordering on Tipperah, Mairi and Assam. They have lately attacked the parties who went out surveying the region for the purpose of obtaining a practicable route by land from India to Burma. They extend down the Chindwin River, and are the only people on the west side of the Irrawaddy not yet reduced to submission and order.

The third expedition is against the Red Karens in the east of Burma, on the border of Siam. A number of Red Karen tribes have united under a chief named Sawlawbaw, who refuses to submit to British rule as his neighbors have done, and whose districts is a centre of active disturbance. There is no desire to interfere with the Karens, provided that they will remain quiet, but this a majority of the Red Karens refuse to do.

Competitive Examination.

An Ann Arbor, Michigan, despatch says: Mr. J. L. Babcock, who is to receive \$500,000 from his uncle's estate, provided he marries in five years after the latter's death, has received so many letters from love-lorn maidens that he proposes to select his wife by means of a competitive examination, held by a committee. All the letters have been filed, and, in due time, all the writers will be notified to appear and be examined as to general health, intelligence, beauty, age, disposition, &c. One Cincinnati beauty wrote to Babcock recently: "I am tired of reading articles about you in the papers. If you want a wife why don't you get one in Ann Arbor, where you are? If you are not suited write me a line."

A Boston girl has offered an Ann Arbor photographer \$10 for a picture of Babcock, but the latter modestly declined to furnish a photograph. Babcock said a few days ago: "I am still receiving an immense number of photographs and letters, and I could have more photographs if I requested the fair writers to forward them."

The presence of Lord Dufferin at the Italian court as the British ambassador is likely to increase the cordiality of the relations between the two countries. There have at different times within the last year been reports of a treaty between Italy and England, but official denials have been given of the accuracy of these statements. There may be no definite agreement of a formal nature with the southern member of the Central European alliance, but possibly the understanding is of a nature to be best preserved by the skill and tact of a trained diplomat, such as Lord Dufferin certainly is. An English contemporary suggests that in Italy the Marquis will find surroundings congenial to those literary tastes which he has, no doubt, been obliged to set aside owing to the pressure of State cares. The suitability of the Italian climate for the health of Lord Dufferin after a sojourn in the heat of India has also been assigned as a reason for Lord Dufferin's acceptance of his present post. Doubtless in addition to these reasons there is the question of delicate negotiation to conduct, which will be safe in his hands.

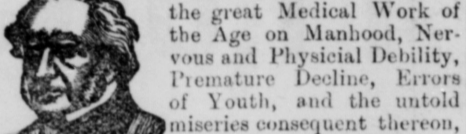
