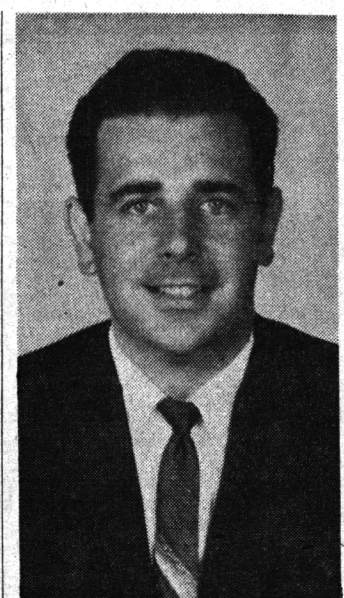

The Prince Edward Island Presbytery of the United Church of Canada held a memorable meeting in the new Park-Royal church on Tuesday the 19th of August. A very large number of delegates and visitors were present when Mr. W.P. MacLeod gave the welcome to the church, at the morning session.

Rev. J.M. Sheen, the retiring Chairman, conducted opening devotions and installed the new Chairman, Rev. J.M. Fraser.

At eleven o'clock, the Moderator of the United Church, Right Rev. James S. Thomson, was accompanied to the church by Mr. Justice Tweedie, chairman of the Committee on the Moderator's visit. The Moderator was met at the door by a welcoming committee, consisting of Rev. Dr. A.S. Weir and Rev. Dr. W.A. MacQuarrie, both former Presidents of the Maritime Conference and Rev. T.A. Wilson and Rev. F.H. Littlejohns, senior members of the Presbytery.

Vickers Gets Contract For Destroyer

Brunswick Oilfields-Gautreau No. 1, as the well will be called, will be drilled with cable tool equipment.

The well will be located on the farm of Yvon Melanson, in the Dover area east of the Stoney Creek oil field and 12 miles south east of Moncton.

Imperial is already drilling exploratory wells in Prince Edward Island.

OTTAWA (CP) - Canadian Vickers Limited, Montreal, has been awarded a contract for construction of the first of a new class of destroyer, officials disclosed Wednesday.

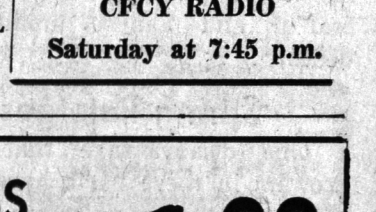
A navy spokesman said the ship will be called the Mackenzie after the river. She will be the first of a planned six-ship program.

Officials said terms of the contract have not been completed but that the contract is based on target-incentive.

This means Vickers will be given as a target a number of man hours of labor for completion of the ship. If the company beats this target it will receive about one-third of the consequent savings, the other two-thirds going to the government. Vickers will also receive a basic profit.

The Mackenzie, an improved version of the Restigouche class destroyer, will be laid down late next month and is scheduled for launching in mid-1960. Target date for completion is 1962.
