Calypso Is Taking Hold

By ROGER STONEBANKS Canadian Press Staff Writer LONDON (CP) - Will calypso knock the rock? Some London record columnists are predicting that the West Indian style, with its clever lyrics and intricate rhythms, will grow in popularity.

"I just can't see it," wrote Pat Brand, editor of Britain's leading musical newspaper Melody Maker. He laid down two prevailing rules for a musical craze. First, it must have a solid beat. Second, you don't have to bother about the words.

The Platters, a rock 'n' roll vocal group now touring Britain, acknowledge the strength of calypso—but don't think it will go as far as rock 'n' roll. "Can you see the kids queuing up and going crazy for it?" asked one of them.

Trinidad-born boogie pianist Winifred Atwell speaks hopefully of a calypso vogue. "I'd like to see it happen," she said. "I was brought up with the music and I love it. But I can't see a real craze in England."

Publicity man Les Perrin doesn't think calypso will get the kids "who flung themselves on the Haley wagon." But he adds, "the public always has the final and conclusive word on these things."

At the moment there are only three calypso to rock numbers in Britain's top 10 best selling records. All three are different recordings of one tune—The Banana Boat Song.

Dulles Biography Makes Loan Withdrawal Deliberate Policy WASHINGTON (AP) - Senator Hubert Humphrey (Dem. Minn.) Monday questioned assertions in a new biography of State Secretary Dulles and demanded that Dulles testify on "his role in the Aswan Dam affair."

The state department said the book, coming out Wednesday, "is not an authorized biography." The author is John Robinson (Jack) Beal, Time magazine's diplomatic reporter in Washington.

Humphrey said the biography's sudden withdrawal last July of an offer to help Egypt build the Aswan Dam was "a cold war gambit." Humphreys said this contradicted testimony Dulles gave to the Senate foreign relations committee.

Humphrey, a committee member, added: "We are again witnessing a determined effort to convert diplomatic blunders into diplomatic wonders. What is more, if the Aswan Dam offer was withdrawn to precipitate a showdown with Russia in the Middle East, it was an example of reckless and unwarranted diplomatic brinkmanship."

State department spokesman Lincoln White told a press conference the biography's description of his policy. He announced, however, Dulles will hold a press conference today and it seemed likely Dulles will be quizzed then about the biography.

"COLD WAR GAMBIT" Beal's book said Dulles deliberately withdrew the U.S. aid offer to Egypt in a "truly major cold war gambit." He said the

aim was to call Russia's economic aid bluff and demonstrate to wavering neutrals in Asia that the United States would not tolerate forever efforts by some countries to work both sides of the East-West street.

"I said Dulles expected Egypt to respond on a grand scale." Egypt's reaction was to seize the Suez Canal in a prelude to Middle East fighting involving Britain, France, Israel, and Egypt.

It was later, when Russia threatened to send in "volunteers" to stop the fighting, that Eisenhower faced his Middle East "Brink." Beal wrote.

He said Eisenhower did this by warning Russia, both publicly and through U.S. ambassador Charles E. Bohlen in Moscow, that U.S. force would oppose any Soviet "volunteers" in the Suez area.

10-Year Term For Human Bomb MONTREAL (CP) - Human bomb Andre Deblois, 25, pleaded guilty Thursday to four charges arising from his bank robbery attempt by dynamite and was sentenced to 10 years in prison on each count. The sentences are to run concurrently.

Deblois was shot down March 5 by a single police bullet as he tried to escape from a bank robbery. He was carried to a stretcher Thursday to a small room behind the main courtroom for speedy trial by Judge Willie Froulx. The police bullet striking his neck and jaw had paralyzed him from the neck down.

Deblois was taken to the criminal court buildings from the Montreal Neurological Institute where he has been since his holdup attempt.

The unemployed machine shop foreman, married with a child, had stolen a cab and then walked into the bank branch grotesquely masked and with six sticks of dynamite, wired to explode at the touch of a button, in his clothes.

He had also planted a powerful time bomb in the CNR Central Station but the bomb, lodged in a baggage locker, failed to go off at its set time and police dismantled it.

Deblois was shot as he sat inside the bank. He fell, arms apart, without a chance to execute his threat to blow himself and the bank occupants up if pursuing police made any effort to stop him.
