Texas and Pacific Coal and Oil declared a 25 cents dividend yesterday. This is the first dividend since 1929. National Distillers is scheduled to have a dividend meeting today. Corn Products directors are scheduled to meet tomorrow and it is believed there will be some consideration given to an extra distribution to stockholders in the form of certain stocks which the company owns. We would expect an irregular firm market again today and would favor Allied Chemical, Dupont, General Motors, Chrysler, General Electric, International Nickel and Loew's.

GRAIN

(Canadian Press) WINNIPEG, June 25—Traders favorable to advancing wheat prices proceeded cautiously in today's session of Winnipeg grain exchange, apparently in the belief a lull in foreign demand for wheat outweighed bullish crop reports. At the close of an irregular session, values were unchanged to 1/4 cent lower. July at 83 3/4, Oct-83 7-8 to 84 and December 84 3-4 cents. Erratic fluctuations prevailed throughout, the price trend closely following that of Chicago. Chicago's mixed trend, where the close was fractionally lower to a shade higher, had much to do with determining Winnipeg's price movements. Liverpool's weakness, 1 1/4 to 5/8 cent down at the finish also was construed as bearish here. Cash and coarse grains prices showed only minor variations.

Currencies

(Canadian Press) NEW YORK, June 25—Sterling and the Canadian dollar were lower, the French franc slightly higher, in the foreign exchange markets today. The Canadian dollar extended its discount from 7-32 to 1-4 per cent. The pound was off 3-8 at \$5.02 while the franc, closing at 6.60 1-4 cents, showed a gain of 10 1-2 of a cent. MONTREAL, June 25—Loss of 7-32 cent was registered by pound sterling on Montreal foreign exchange today at \$5.03 1-4. The United States dollar was up 1-32 cent at 1-4 premium while the French franc gained .01 cent at 6.62 cents.

GRAIN

(Canadian Press) CHICAGO, June 25—For the second day in succession, fears of possible heavy imports of Canadian wheat into the United States put a damper today on upturns of domestic prices of breadstuffs. Tendrils also to hold the wheat market at anchor despite increasing reports of drought havoc in spring crop states were larger arrivals of newly-harvested winter wheat south. Wichita received 306 cars, Hutchinson 197, and Enid 167. Wheat closed irregular, 1-8 lower to 1-2 higher compared with yesterday's finish, July 95 5-8 to 3-4, Sep 96 1-8 to 1-4, corn 1-4 off to 1-4 up, Sep 65 1-4 to 3-8, oats 3-8 to 5-8 advanced, and provisions showing 10 to 15 cents decline.

Late Sown Annual For Bloom

A gay display of annuals is altogether within the range of practical gardening up to July 1. It is only necessary to select those which are of short-blooming seasons and come into flower quickly. The cornflowers and annual poppies will give beautiful display in short order. The annual larkspurs in spin up in no time to bloom in warm weather, and the French marigolds will get into bearing in time for a wonderful display during the fall when the cool nights bring out the rich crimson and mahogany in their blossoms. The annual gypsophila needs sowing every two weeks all summer. Late-sown salvias come at just the right time with their flaming scarlet in fall. Phlox Drummondii is a fast grower. The giant zinnias might not be their best, but the little pompons will. The heliopsis, everlasting, are welcome for winter displays. The portulaca is good for a hot spot. Four-o'clocks make rapid progress from seed sown in the summer.

MINING

(Canadian Press) TORONTO, June 25—Moderate weakness in the medium-price gold group and the base metals today gave the Toronto mining board a downward slant which was qualified by a firming tendency in the final phase. Oil stocks registered improvement and in the silvers, Eldorado came to life and registered a net advance of 10 cents to \$1. The exchange index for the golds was off a point to 139.80 and the miscellaneous mines index lost 3-4 of a point to 131.58. Volume at 1,139,000 was the smallest since May 1. A steady to strong price tone among the senior golds helped to minimize the appearance of weakness in other groups. McIntyre, off 3-8, had the only decline. Hollinger and Pioneer chalked up narrow gains and Lake Shore, Teck Hughes, Wright Hargreaves and Buffalo-Ankerite held unchanged. Minor gains were posted also for Macassa, Mining Corporation, Premier, Preston and East Malartic. The soft spots included Little Long Lac, off 15 cents, Perron, off 8, San Antonio, off 7 and issues down 3 to 5 cents included McLeod-Cocksbutt, McKenzie, Hard Rock, Chibougamau, Canadian Malartic, Red Lake, Reno and Toronto.
