Then, wanting to reach dummy for a heart lead toward the closed hand, South made the natural play of laying down the top spades and a third round for a ruff. 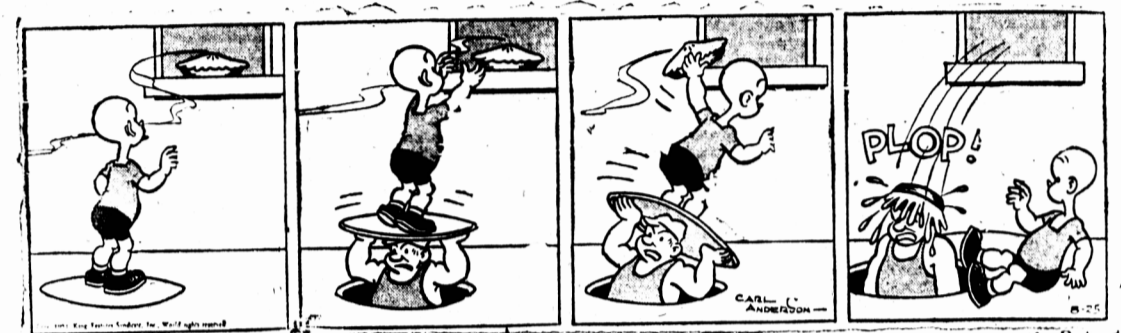

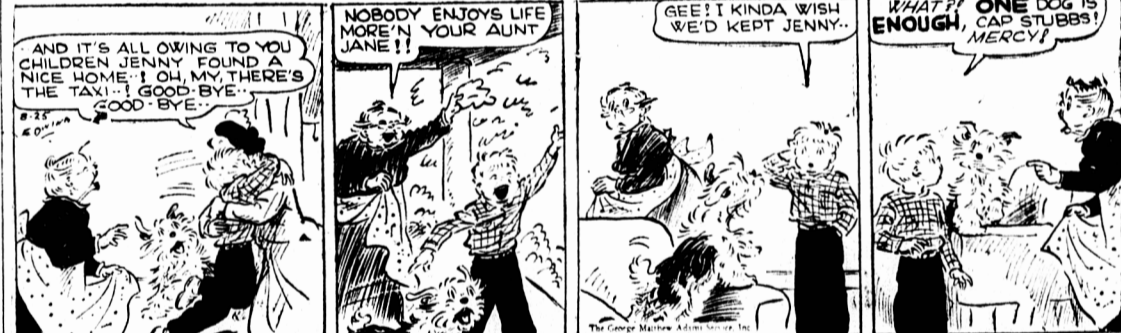

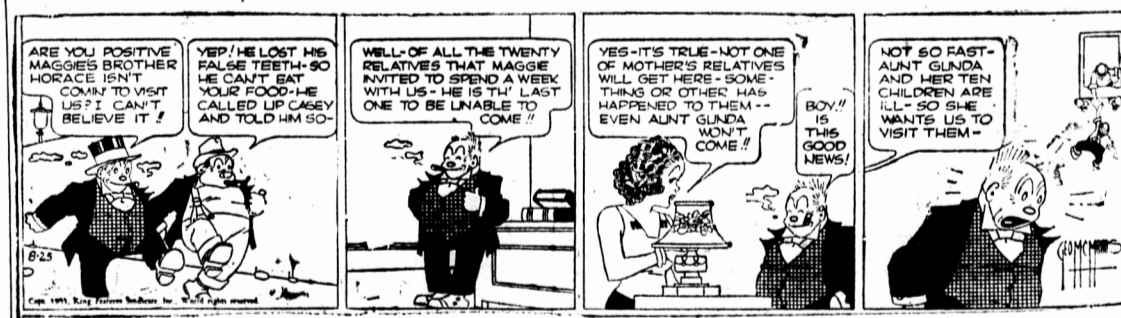
