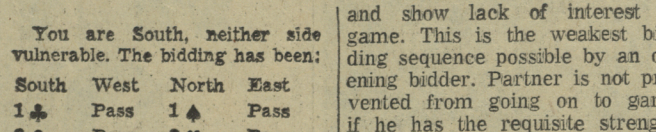

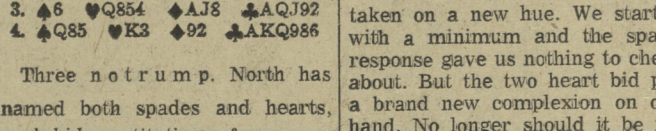

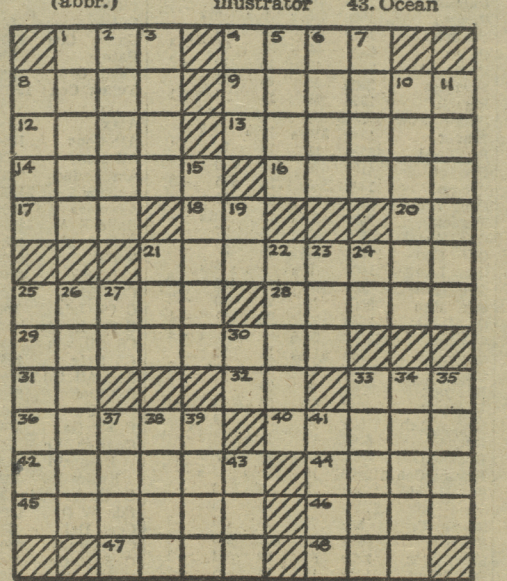

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CONTRACT BRIDGE

QUIZ

You are South, neither side vulnerable. The bidding has been:

South West North East
1. Pass 1. Pass
2. Pass 2. Pass

What would you now bid with each of the following hands?

1. ♠A4 ♥Q5 ♣A6 ♦KJ784
2. ♠A7 ♥Q8 ♣A8 ♦KQJ986
3. ♠Q85 ♥A3 ♣AQJ92
4. ♠Q85 ♥K3 ♣2 ♦AKQ86

Three notrump. North has named both spades and hearts, each bid constituting a force compelling us to bid again. Therefore care must be taken in rebidding at this point not to act as though our bid is being made under the compulsion of partner's forcing bids.

Since the hand is by no means a minimum opening bid, and to date we have not yet shown our surplus strength, the duty arises to do more than bid two notrump. The three notrump bid conveys the impression previously created by the signoff of two clubs, and tells partner there are extra, though limited, values. The jump bid not only assures a game contract, but also informs partner of slam possibilities if he is so minded.

2. Three clubs. By bidding one, two, and three clubs, we identify the relatively weak opening bid, and show lack of interest in game. This is the weakest bidding sequence possible by an opening bidder. Partner is not prevented from going on to game if he has the requisite strength to continue in the face of two warnings. All we can do is flash the red light. A two notrump bid would be more encouraging towards game.

3. Four hearts. The hand has taken on a new hue. We started with a minimum and the spade response gave us nothing to cheer about. But the two heart bid put a brand new complexion on our hand. No longer should it be regarded as weak, in view of its great elevation in value once a heart fit is discovered. A three heart bid might sound to partner like a forced bid made on minimum values. By jumping to four we make it clear that the heart raise is not a duty but a pleasure.

4. Three spades. A two spade bid, being merely a preference for spades against hearts, would sound dreadfully weak to partner, and might be passed by him with a hand good enough to merit a game contract.

Partner presumably has a good hand since he keeps on forcing us to bid. Our hand, with 14 high card points and sufficient flexibility to play for game at either spades or notrump, cannot, under the circumstances, be regarded as weak. A jump bid to three spades is in order.

Prince Philip To Fly 6,000 Miles For Friendship Toast

OTTAWA (CP)—Prince Philip flies 6,000 miles next week to propose a toast to Commonwealth-United States friendship.

In one of the most fleeting visits his royalty has paid to a far-off destination, he leaves London for Ottawa by Comet airliner Tuesday, makes a couple of brief speeches and heads for home the following Friday, Oct. 31.

It will be Philip's fourth visit to Canada. He is coming as president of the English-Speaking Union of the Commonwealth, and is to take a leading part at the union's third post-war conference of world branches, starting Sunday.

Canada Could Contribute To Space Science

TORONTO (CP)—A leading rocket expert says Canada could have made a great contribution to space science instead of pouring \$400,000,000 "down the drain" developing the supersonic CF-105 interceptor aircraft.

The comment was made Tuesday night by Kurt R. Stehling, former Canadian scientist and now head of a U.S. naval rocket research laboratory in Washington.

"Why don't you Canadians leave the building of supersonic planes to the Americans?" he said in an interview before appearing on the CBC-TV show, Front Page Challenge.

"A gigantic economy is needed to construct this type of aircraft. The amount Canada spent on the CF-105 is more than the U.S. spent on the highly successful Vanguard rocket which powered the Pioneer 79212 miles into space," he said.

Mr. Stehling, a consultant in the Vanguard project, told the TV panel that although Canada is making a small contribution to rocket research, it should abandon development of supersonic aircraft and concentrate on missiles.

LEAVES \$246,229 ESTATE

VANCOUVER (CP)—The will of Sir George Bury, former vice-president of the Canadian Pacific Railway who died here July 20 at the age of 92, has been filed for probate in the British Columbia Supreme Court. Sir George left an estate of \$246,229, with liabilities totalling \$6,307. His widow, Lady May Aylton Bury, 90, of Vancouver was left a life income from the estate.
