## Physical Fitness Program Being Pushed By Legion

MONTAGUE BUREAU OF THE GUARDIAN Hamilton Douglas, Mt. Stewart, director of physical fitness, Provincial Command of the Canadian Legion, was the guest speaker at the Montague Canadian Legion monthly meeting held last night. He briefly outlined sports and physical training to be sponsored

by the Canadian Legion and stated that a resolution was passed and is to be presented to the provincial government and the department of education for their consideration.

The program which does not require a trained instructor would begin in the lower grades and continue to the university level.

He stressed the importance of such elementary physical training as standing, sitting, and walking correctly as the basis for mental and physical well being.

## Teachers And Environment Seen Essentials Of Education

The two basic essentials of a strong educational system were good teachers and suitable teaching environment, Malcolm MacKenzie told the Bunbury ratepayers last night.

Guest speaker at the official opening of the district's new school, the duty minister and director of education said that in the 100 years since the first school was erected in the district, the world had shown very considerable material advancement but had failed to show similar progress in the fields of social organization and spirituality.

People as a whole today were inclined to be indifferent to isolated suffering such as experienced by displaced persons, war prisoners, refugees, etc.

He recalled that though most persons professed to recognize the fatherhood of God and the brotherhood of man, yet the past 100 years had produced no less than 25 wars.

To have achieved such an excellent result, cooperation must have prevailed in the district from the beginning of the project.

Mr. MacKenzie said. Other speakers included hon. L. G. Dewar, M.D., provincial minister of education, architect Keith Pickard, supervisor Claude Wood, and Donald Stewart, chairman of the district Board of Trustees.
