CANADA SOUTHERN TO SPEND MONEY. WINNIPEG, Ont., Feb. 26.—The Canada Southern has made application to the Canadian Parliament for the right to expropriate certain lands and divert a street and close another here, in connection with the new tunnel. The yards of the company are to be moved back a considerable distance, and the approach to the tunnel is to be made long to reduce the grade. Reduction of grade is the principal reason for the open trench method of construction by which the floors of the tubes will be only a few feet below the bed of the river. The application places the value of improvements to be made on the Canadian side in connection with the tunnels at over four million dollars.
