# Orioles Take 6th Straight; Boston Defeats Indians

BALTIMORE (AP) — Baltimore Orioles scored a run with-out a hit in the eighth inning Wednesday night and defeated New York Yankees 3-2, extending its winning streak to six.

The Orioles loaded the bases against Yankee starter Mel Stottlemyre on a walk, a sacrifice and an intentional walk to Frank Robinson.

Brooks Robinson, who had homered in the fourth for the first Baltimore run, hit a hard grounder which third baseman Cleve Boyer bobbled and then tried for a double play starting at second base instead of getting a force at the plate.

Baltimore tied the score 2-2 in the seventh on Boog Powell's bloop single to center.

Through the first six innings, the only hit off Stottlemyre was Brooks Robinson's 22nd homer.

CLEVELAND (AP) — Jose Tartabull's bases-loaded single in the sixth inning broke a 1-1 deadlock and launched a four-run rally as Boston Red Sox defeated Cleveland Indians 5-4 Wednesday night.

The Boston uprising kayoed

George Culver in his first major league start after coming up from the Indian's Portland farm club.

After Tartabull dropped his single into center, Joe Foy drove in another run with a sacrifice fly off reliever Tom Kelley. George Scott's single added ST. LOUIS (AP) — Tim McCarver's two-run homer off Mike Cuellar in the eighth carried St. Louis Cardinals to a 6-3 victory over Houston Astros Wednesday night.

The Cardinals, held hitless by Dave Giusti for the first five innings, trailed by 5-1 after six.

Then Mike Shannon smacked a two-run homer in a three-run seventh against Giusti and Carroll Sembera.

Cuellar, taking over with the bases loaded and nobody out in the seventh, got Lou Brock to hit into a double play and struck out Jerry Buchek.

The Astros scored twice off starter Larry Jaster in the fourth and added three in the sixth when John Bateman socked his 17th homer and Bob Aspromonte pounded a two-run double.
