Says Canada Considering Atom-Powered Warships

VICTORIA (CP)—Canada has reached the end of her regular naval shipbuilding program and now is embarked on a study of nuclear-powered vessels, Defence Minister George Peckes said Monday.

AIR MISSILES FIRST

The emphasis in Canada would be on air-powered missiles such as the Sparrow III, rather than ground-air intercontinental ballistic missiles in this country, but Mr. Peckes said he could "foresee the possibility of a request being made in the future."

Mr. Peckes said Canada is working "very closely" with the U.S. on future missile requirements.
