British Government Given Okay For Revision Of Police Forces

By JOSEPH MACSWEEEN LONDON (CP) — The Labor government has won general approval of its plan for a virtual revolution among Britain's police forces — study symbols of stability ranking almost with the monarchy and the Royal Navy.

"We are still sending out policemen with a truncheon and a police whistle — while astronauts talk to their wives from outer space," said George Nichols, chief constable of Bath, whose 140 men are joining up with the Somerset force.

A thief who steals a car in Bradford and drives it to Blackpool, only 65 miles away, would pass through the territories of 17 different police forces. Under the Jenkins plan, the seven will be amalgamated into two forces.

News-papers were unanimous in praise of Home Secretary Roy Jenkins' formula for wholesale merging of police forces in England and Wales to reduce the total number to 49 from 111.

Personnel will not be reduced. But Jenkins' plan goes further along the road of amalgamation than was envisaged in the recommendations of a royal commission that reported four years ago at a time of public criticism of the police.

The commission investigated reasons for growing public concern that the British bobby might not always be the wondrously helpful chap admired by tourists. The old image of a beaming bobby who could charm apple pies away from amorous couples lacked something in a modern context of increasing crime, particularly violent crime.

Unlike most countries, Britain has no state police and will not have any under the reorganization, which Jenkins expects to push through by April, 1968, at the latest.

"I greatly hope that the local authorities concerned will recognize the need for these proposals and enter into voluntary schemes," Jenkins told the House of Commons in his Wednesday announcement. "But if they do not, I must use my powers under the Police Act, 1964, to promote compulsory amalgamation."

Local police authorities administer their own forces under the guidance of the home secretary in England and Wales and of the secretary of state for Scotland in his jurisdiction.

Although the police are not organized in a unified national force, their duties and functions are the same throughout Britain. There are a number of common services, including training schemes and forensic science services.

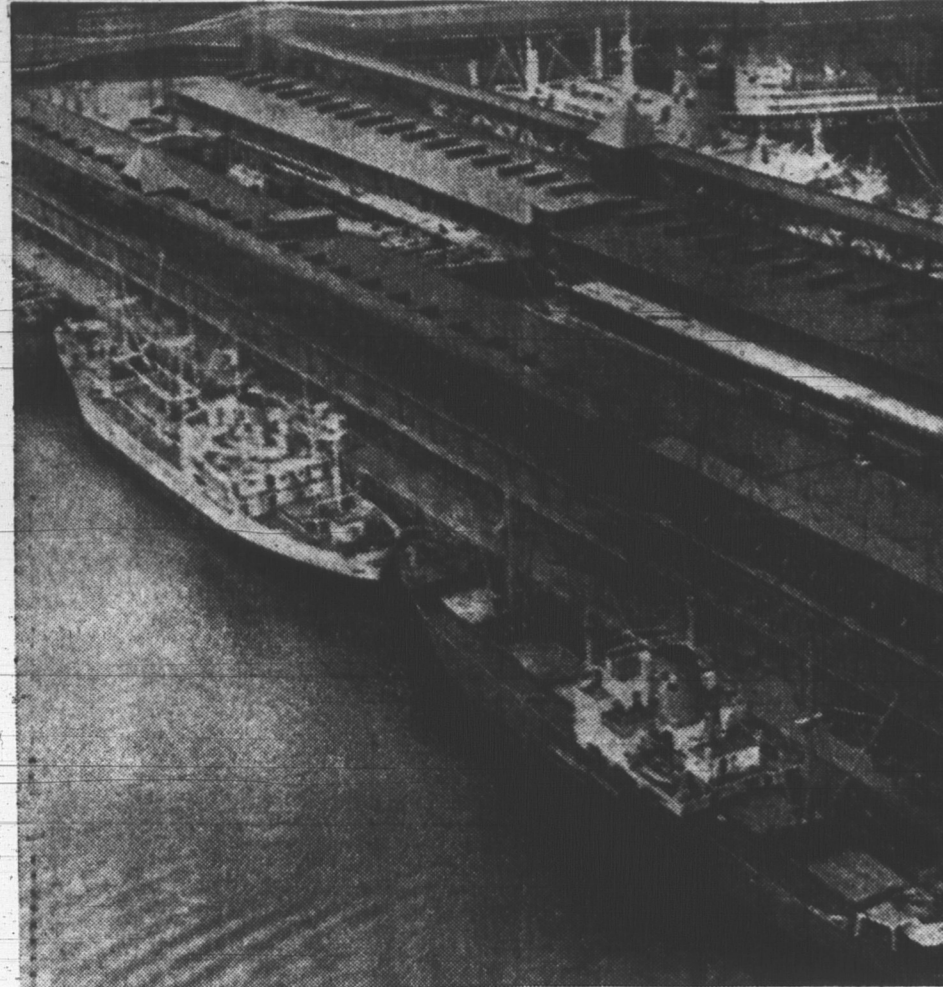
