Strange But True

In 1847 the Rev. Mr. Hunter began building Christ Church at The Pas, Manitoba, to replace the one built many years earlier and presided over by the Rev. Henry Budd, a Cree Indian, who had been educated in England. It is interesting to note here that the pews and furniture of the first church were made by men who were members of the ill-fated Franklin Expedition.

When the new church was erected in 1866 all the equipment was transferred from the pioneer church. Guarding the front door of the church is a massive lock measuring seventeen by fourteen inches and almost two inches thick. It is manipulated by a heavy iron key seven inches long, and a hand-forged latch is of equally generous proportions with a horizontal bar eighteen inches long.

The pew ends are made of heavy planks and the high tops are carved in a "fleur de lis" design, while on the backs of the seats can still be seen the Indian's method of marking the days of the week and an X for the Lord's Day.

Two sizable tablets bear the Ten Commandments written in Cree, and two others have the Lord's Prayer and fragments of Scripture. Two quaintly carved chairs occupy the sanctuary, while a third constructed of native birch was made by the lost expedition.

carpenters. Resting on the pulpit is a massive old family Bible bound in heavy black leather and illustrated by nearly 1,000 engravings. This historic church is still in use, still in an excellent state of preservation and forms a link which cements the greatness of our great Dominion.

Still pointing out over Hudson Bay are a few old cannon that never fired a shot in the fortress defense. History records that Samuel Hearne, then Governor and a better explorer than a soldier, surrendered the fort to the French without a battle and was taken prisoner to France. When England and France made peace in 1763, Hearne went back to take charge of Churchill. He never did anything about restoring the old fort.

Time was when the world admired the man who had the courage to lift his head above the crowd and speak his mind. But there is very little demand for such a man today. The world wants preachers who get their sermons out of life, not out of a library; it wants physicians who are not afraid to depart from the precedent of those who have gone before, and politicians who think of country first, and selves second. There is nothing else which will kill the creative faculty and paralyze growth more quickly than following precedent in everything, and doing everything just as somebody else did it.

Perhaps you have not heard of Charlie Duck, the Indian guide and historian. But the Canadian government has and the Royal Canadian police and missionaries of Manitoba are scouring the north country for Charlie's note book which became lost soon after he died several years ago. Why? Because Charlie Duck wrote the history of the Cree tribe as well as the caribou's mysterious sweeps across Canada's northland, and the very lives of the vanishing tribe may depend upon finding it.

Canada and the United States are the only two countries in the world which can boast of an international peace garden. 888 acres of this garden lie in the state of North Dakota, and 1,451 acres lie on the Canadian side of the border. Placed exactly astride the international line is a plaque with the following words: "To God in His glory we two nations dedicate this garden and pledge ourselves that as long as men shall live we will not take up arms against one another." The board of directors for the garden are chosen jointly from citizens of both countries. The province of Manitoba lies right in what is known as the

"Mississippi flyway." This is one of the four principal waterfowl flyways of America. In general, the route follows the Mississippi and Red River valleys, leading north westward by northward across the continent.

The bells of St. Boniface have shared in a variety of experiences. The three of them, on their way to the new world in 1840, weighing more than 1800 pounds, caused the first recorded strike in Canada when dock laborers refused to handle them because of their weight. Five times they travelled the broad Atlantic and became the inspiring theme of Whittier's famous poem "The Red River Voyagers." They were the Red River's first chimes — the famed bells of St. Boniface Cathedral. Little did Wesley Bond realize

that his visit to St. Boniface in 1861 would cause the bells to echo throughout the world. Bond, a resident of Philadelphia, told the story of the bells in a local paper, and poet Whittier who happened to be visiting the Quaker City at the time, read the account and then wrote the song, the first two verses of which reads: "Is it the clang of wild geese? Is it the Indian's yell, That lends to the voice of the northwest The tones of the far off bells?"

The bells of the Roman Mission. They call from the turrets twain, To the boatman on the river, To the hunter on the plain!"
