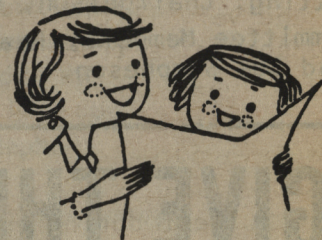
In the gamesroom, there was evident lack of control
