AN ADDED REASON FOR THANKSGIVING

Not only in the larger centers do people get so involved with their immediate affairs that they lose contact with those whose company they truly value.

Occasionally even, one met new people - folks seen here and there but who had never been formally introduced. Nice to add a friendly nod and greeting to the never too long list.

Another pleasant feature of the reception is the spread of goodwill to a considerable portion of the population not present. Miss Evans, the dressmaker, for instance, phoned me a few days before the affair. "My," she said, "dresses are coming in by the dozens. I only hope I can get them done in time." (She did) And in the same way the art, services, the merchandise of many other individuals and business concerns contributed to the success of the reception. Mostly the activities cater to the needs of the women . . . which brings me to the Men!

Two years ago I attended a reception at Government House for Women Only. I expressed pity for the men who couldn't possibly have as much fun at such functions. Last week it was a mixed party, and I am still of the same opinion.

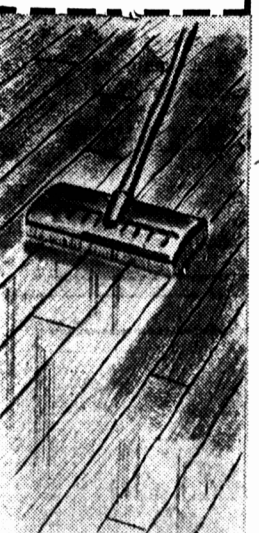
