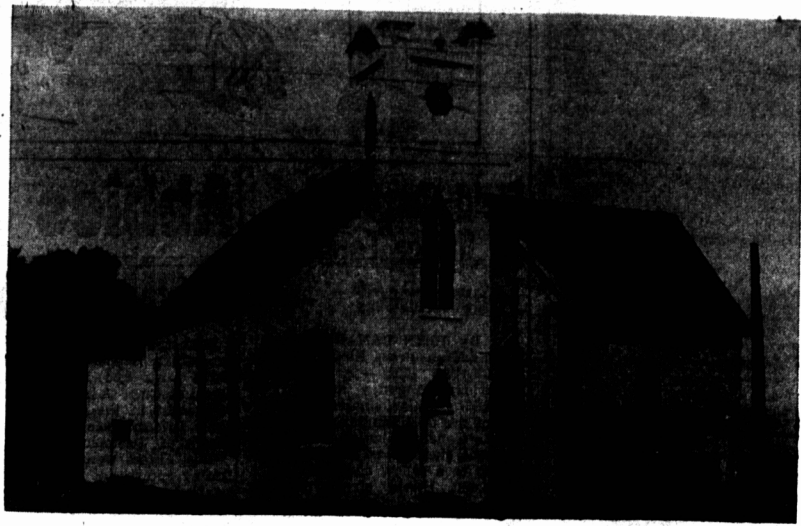

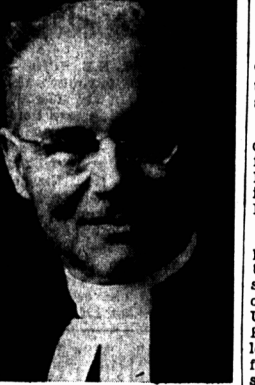

News Briefs

QUEBEC, (CP)—Lorenzo Melancon, 26, of nearby St. gregoire de Montmorency, was sentenced Thursday to two years in penitentiary after he admitted indecently assaulting a housewife in her home.

TOKYO, (AP)—Three Canadian destroyers recently completed a four-day goodwill visit to Otaru on Hokkaido, Japan's northernmost island. The destroyers were the Haida, Cayuga and Crusader.

WASHINGTON, (AP)— Congress passed a bill Thursday outlawing the Communist party as "an instrumentality of a conspiracy to overthrow the government of the United States." Senator William Knowland of California, Republican leader in the Senate, expressed confidence that Eisenhower would sign the bill.

EDMUNDSTON N. B. (CP) — Ten cars of a 19-car extra freight train of the Canadian National Railways were derailed from unknown cause Thursday between Notre Dame de Lac and Ste. Rose du Dejele in Quebec about 20 miles north of Edmundston. None was seriously damaged and no one was hurt.

ELMVALE, Ont. (CP) — Two-year-old Richard James Graham was killed when a truck ran over him while picking up milk at his parents' farm Thursday. Driver of the truck, Grant Ball, 22, of Waverley told police he saw no one in the yard when he drove in and said his first indication of the accident was when he saw the boy in the rear-view mirror as he drove away. Elmvale is 18 miles northwest of Barrie.

Heart Attack

From the Brussels EDC meeting, West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer sent a message declaring "the loss of de Gasperi is a blow for everybody who cares for the future of Europe."

De Gasperi's long-time political foe, Italian Communist chief Palmiro Togliatti, joined in the condolences, wiring de Gasperi's widow that he was "always mindful of having served with him the cause of the people and of liberty in the hardest moments of our country."

It had been generally expected that de Gasperi would have been elected president of Italy next year at the end of the term of incumbent Luigi Einaudi.

De Gasperi ended his 7 1/2 years as head of the Italian government a year ago, in July 1953. He resigned after losing a confidence vote in parliament, but his party kept its political grip and successive premiers have been Christian Democrats.

Although there had been reports of poor health, de Gasperi's death came without any prior public hint that he was seriously ill. Only after his death was it revealed that he suffered a heart attack a week ago. De Gasperi's body will be brought to Rome Sunday. The final service—a solemn state funeral—will be held Monday in Rome's basilica of San Lorenzo.
