CITY OF CHARLOTTETOWN
Regulations to be Enforced at the Teepee Incinerator as of May 16th, 1964

1. REFUSE COLLECTION CONTRACTOR
As provided in the present contracts, the firm of Jenkins and Clark will not be required to pay any charges for disposal of refuse collected in the City of Charlottetown and in the Villages of Sherwood and Parkdale.

2. CITY BUSINESS FIRMS
There will not be any charge made to any commercial or industrial firm or other business firms, or individuals in business, located in Charlottetown, Sherwood, or Parkdale for any additional refuse arising from their business hauled to the Disposal Area either by their own or hired trucks. A permit must first be obtained from City Hall, however, for any truck to use this refuse disposal area. This type of permit is issued for a price of one dollar per year.

3. OTHER COMMUNITIES
Should any other communities contract for Refuse Collection then it is recommended that these communities negotiate with the City on a per capita basis as was done with Parkdale and Sherwood.

4. DEMOLITION OF BUILDINGS
Rubble from the demolition of buildings and other structures may be disposed of at the Refuse Disposal Area. All material must be dumped where directed. Tickets for this rubble be issued at a price of One Dollar (\$1.00) per truck load.

5. CHARGES
The following system of charges be adopted with payment to be by tickets purchased in advanced at City Hall with absolutely no cash payments to be made at the Disposal Site. The tickets be made up in booklets of twenty (20).

TYPE OF VEHICLE Color of Ticket Cost
A. Passenger Cars & Trailers . . . . . Red \$ .50 each
B. Pick-up, panel, and up to and including a 1 ton truck . . . . . Green .50 each
C. Refuse Collection Contract Trucks when hauling from Charlottetown, Parkdale, Sherwood) No charge
D. Other trucks hauling from businesses in Charlottetown, Parkdale and Sherwood . . . . . Yellow By permit \$1.00 year per truck
E. All other trucks . . . . . White \$1.00 per load
F. Old car bodies . . . . . No Charge
