THE USES OF PEAT.

Its Value for Packing Purposes.

It Can be Made into Bricks, Carpets and Fuel and has Many Remarkable Qualities.

The Handels Museum publishes an extract from an article by Dr. Leo Pribyl, who maintains that peat is a valuable material, the uses of which, except as fuel and litter, are as yet very limited.

HAS REACHED ITS DESTINATION in perfect condition. Peat is also successfully used for preserving fresh fruit; even grapes may be made to retain their fresh appearance for months, and, owing to the high prices of this fruit in the spring and summer, would amply repay the trifling expense incurred by the use of peat dust.

THE PRESERVATIVE QUALITIES OF PEAT might here again be illustrated, and a satisfactory solution of this important question be arrived at. It has been found a drawback in the use of artificial salino manure that in wet weather it forms itself into hard lumps, which cannot be scattered by the manure-spreading machines.

WELL ADAPTED FOR ISOLATED PURPOSES. Peat dust has been recommended as an excellent ingredient for use in the manufacture of light, porous bricks, being mixed with the clay previously to baking.

INADEQUATE TO MEET THE DEMAND, considering the varied uses of this unpretentious raw material. The chemical industry is using peat in the manufacture of charcoal, peat coke, peat gas, etc., thus converting a cheap raw material into a valuable industrial product.

PROVIDED IN SUCH ABUNDANCE, even if it be in many districts partially distributed, is destined not only to benefit agriculture by its valuable properties and chemical composition, but to lay the foundation of a flourishing and widespread industry.
